Interactive telehealth equipment will be installed at 10 locations in Franklin, Jefferson, Marion, Montgomery and Walker counties in Alabama. This project will increase rural access to health care treatment and services, reduce costs and travel time, and reduce incarcerations and drug-related emergencies. It will potentially assist more than 48,000 residents.

The project will expand the telemedicine network at 11 locations in American Samoa and link them to a hub site in Ventura, Calif. This project also will use telemedicine equipment for telepathology and tele-dentistry and training programs potentially benefiting 55,533 residents.

This project will create efficient and effective access to health care for more than 172,000 people.

This project will expand access to evidence-based practices for opioid misuse disorders, including a medication-assisted therapy program and peer recovery services. Services will be available to more than 10,000 residents.

The project's goal is to reduce fatal opioid-related overdoses and opioid misuse in general through prevention education to community members and health care providers in rural areas. The project will also provide recovery and support training to community members and care providers to help people with opioid misuse disorders begin recovery, avoid relapses and seek employment.

The project will increase rural access to education, training, and health care resources serving more than 35,017 residents.

This project will improve services and emergency response times affecting more than 2,000 patients, thereby helping to reduce opioid overdose and substance misuse deaths.

This project will increase the capacity to train peer support recovery specialists and other health care professionals in communities with large numbers of opioid overdoses. Approximately 25,000 people will have access to these benefits.

Interactive video equipment will be installed at five locations in the remote Northeast Kingdom (Essex, Orleans, Caledonia, and Orange counties) and in Windham County, Vermont. This project will build a virtual recovery coaching network using advanced, easy-to-use behavioral health telemedicine technology allowing certified recovery coaches to support the patients. The project is expected to coach 1,481 people from a community of 26,037 rural residents.
