This project is located in a poverty and StrikeForce area. The project is expected to create 21 jobs. United South and Eastern \$500,000 To create a pilot health project to assist Tribal medical providers with TN Tribes<sup>PP</sup> revenue cycle management and increase revenues through third-party billing. Solid Waste Training Institute<sup>SF</sup> To demonstrate the feasibility of redesigning resource life cycles by UT \$177,286 generating marketable commodities from the municipal solid waste stream. Lummi Community Development \$125,000 To provide entrepreneurship education and training opportunities to WA **Financial Institution** members of Lummi Nation and to others in the surrounding area.
