The USDA's Community Facilities Direct Loan Program funds projects that serve essential community needs, such as hospitals, schools, water-treatment facilities and public-health institutions like the Peabody Home.

This healthcare investment will be used to build a modern senior-living community. The Peabody Home has been operating as a nursing home since the 1940s, and has built a stellar reputation with residents, family members, staff and the community.

The 80-year old building has exhausted its useful life and is failing to meet elderly care needs of the 21st century. Building on the professional services Peabody Home currently provides, the new building will offer three levels of care: independent living, assisted living and memory care. The upgraded design will also include a beauty and barber shop!
