Multifamily Housing Rental Assistance Program

What does this program do?

USDA Rural Development provides rental assistance to owners of properties with an existing Multifamily Housing Direct or Farm Labor Housing loan. This assistance is property based, and intended to help very-low and low-income tenants with rent and utilities.

Program Overview

Who Can Apply?

Rental Assistance is provided to new or existing Multifamily Housing Direct and Farm Labor Housing properties.

Who Can Receive Assistance?

Properties with very-low or lowincome tenants qualify to receive assistance. Properties with very low-income tenants receive first priority.

- Very-low income is defined as at or below 50 percent of the area median income.
- Low income is defined as 50 – 80 percent of the area median income.

Eligibility

 Current owners of Multifamily Housing Direct and Farm Labor Housing properties are eligible, provided they are compliant with all program requirements.

Fund Usage

 With help from the Rental Assistance program, a qualified applicant or tenant pays no more than 30 percent of their income for housing.

- Very-low and low-income tenants eligible to receive rental assistance pay 30 percent of their income in rent, and rental assistance pays the balance of the monthly rental charge.
- Funds are paid directly to property owners on behalf of tenants and become part of the property's income to offset operational expenses.
- Only units Rural Development determines as habitable are eligible for rental assistance.
