# What does this program do?

The Electric Infrastructure Loan and Loan Guarantee Program finances the construction of electric facilities and improvements to electric service in rural areas.

# Who can apply for this program?

Electric distribution, generation, and transmission providers serving rural areas, including:

- State and local governments
- Federally recognizaed Tribes
- Nonprofits, including cooperatives
- For-profit businesses (must be a corporation or limited liability company)

#### How can funds be used?

Funds can be used to finance electric facility construction and improvement, including:

- Maintenance
- Upgrades
- Expansion
- Replacement of distribution, sub transmission, and headquarters (service, warehouse) facilities
- · Energy efficiency upgrades
- Renewable energy systems
