California State and County Agricultural Profiles Available Now

With over 6 million data points available in the initial release of the 2017 Census of Agriculture, NASS created additional products to help tell the story of agriculture at the state and county level. Your <u>California State and County Profiles</u> were released May 30, 2019 and are online now. The profiles show ranked items within the U.S. and the State, as well as level changes from the 2012 Ag Census for select commodities. Also included are economic and producer characteristics. Sales Closing Date Nears for Crop Insurance Programs

USDA Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds producers that the final dates to apply for crop insurance are approaching. **July 1, 2019** is the last day to buy or change your policy for Potatoes and Strawberries. Producers need to purchase, review, or modify their crop insurance

policies before these sales closing dates have passed. Crop insurance provides protection against crop production losses due to natural perils such as drought, hail, and excessive moisture. Crop insurance is sold and delivered solely through private crop insurance agents. In order to receive premium subsidies, the insured must certify that they meet Highly Erodible Land Conservation and Wetland Conservation requirements (AD-1026) with Farm Service Agency (FSA). Almond Marketing Order Updates

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) announced three amendments to the almond marketing order were approved by almond producers in April. The changes apply specifically to nominations to the Almond Board of California, the administrative committee charged with administering the provisions of the marketing order, which is overseen by USDA.

The almond producers will vote again in late July and early August as part of a mandated continuance referendum. At that time, the producers will indicate whether they favor continuance of the marketing order. This continuance referendum is required every five years under the almond marketing order. Funding Opportunities

USDA to Help Cover Producers' Costs for Organic Certification

USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced that organic producers and handlers can apply for federal funds to assist with the cost of receiving and maintaining organic certification through the Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP). Applications for fiscal 2019 funding are due Oct. 31, 2019. Certified producers and handlers are eligible to receive reimbursement for up to 75 percent of certification costs each year, up to a maximum of \$750 per certification scope, including crops, livestock, wild crops, handling and state organic program fees. USDA Seeks Applications to Repair Housing in Rural Communities

USDA Rural Development is requesting applications for its <u>Housing Preservation Grant</u> program to help make housing repairs for low and very-low-income rural residents. Eligible applicants include municipalities, public agencies, federally recognized Indian tribes and nonprofit and faith-based organizations. Applications are due by **July 8, 2019**. NRCS Invites Proposals for 2019 Conservation Innovation Grants

USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in California is now accepting proposals for its Conservation Innovation Grants (CIG) program. Up to \$500,000 is available for one- to three-year grants. The maximum award amount for any project will not exceed \$75,000 in fiscal year 2019. Proposals are due by **June 10, 2019**. Applicants are encouraged to explore the full program announcement to better match their proposals to these needs.
