2013 Project Highlights:

- Wilmington College (Clinton County) received a \$19.7 million Community Facility loan. The funds are being used to construct a 13,500-square foot addition to the existing 50-year-old Kettering Hall. The combined facility will then house the university's Center for the Sciences and Agriculture. Completion is expected in the summer of 2015.
- The Elm Valley Joint Fire District received a \$1,708,000 Community Facility loan it will use for the construction of a new firehouse in Ashley (Delaware County). The new structure will replace two outdated, inadequate buildings. The consolidated facility will lower departmental operating costs and will enable the district to provide enhanced services to residents.
- Muskingum County Business Incubator (MCBI) - \$92,000 Rural Business Enterprise Grant funds will be used to create a kitchen incubator and food hub in Zanesville. The organization's goal is to assist six businesses and create and save 11 jobs.
- Headquartered in Fairborn (Greene County), Dovetail Energy, LLC received a REAP loan/grant combination totaling \$2,625,000. The funds will be used to assist farmers, ranchers and rural small businesses in developing renewable energy systems, and in making energy efficiency improvements to their operations. This project also will generate 4.8+ kWh through the construction and installation of an anaerobic digester.
- Midwest Electric Cooperative (Mercer County) received a \$300,000 Rural Economic Development Grant it will use to expand an existing revolving loan fund that serves rural businesses in Mercer, Allen, Auglaize, Van Wert, Shelby, Dark and Putnam Counties along the state's western border. Additionally, the initial loan from the fund will allow Mercer County to assist in financing the installation of a water and sewer line for a planned industrial park in eastern Mercer County.
