

Innovation Learning Center-KCC Lakeview

- Fall 2013, KCC-Lake County students (synchronous, inperson, online) earned a total of 310 credits
- Fall 2014, students earned **472** credits.
- Fall 2015 students earned 503 credits.
- Winter 2016 credit count came in at 613 credits





Effects of Synchronous Efforts -

KCC increased dual credit students from 544 to 840 (a 54% increase in one year!)
