

Calculating Projected Jobs and Number of Business Assisted:

Jobs Projected:

1. Any jobs created as a direct result of grant funding (*i.e. project manager was hired to work on project for which funding was requested = one job created*).
2. For technical assistance programs, training to a business or entrepreneur that will implement a startup business will count towards jobs created. Training to aspiring entrepreneurs that does not directly result in the startup of a business does not count towards jobs created.
3. For revolving loan funds, the same rules apply to the ultimate recipients. The jobs created by the ultimate recipient must be a direct result from the project financed by the revolving loan fund.

NOTE: The number you put under jobs created must be able to be verified. The jobs created must be a direct result from grant funding. Indirect jobs will not count towards jobs created.

Businesses Assisted:

1. Tally of any business enterprises or entrepreneurs that are directly benefitting or receiving assistance from the project funded.
2. For technical assistance programs, the grantees that were provided funding to conduct training will be a business assisted. Any business the grantees assist will also count as a business assisted. Training to aspiring entrepreneurs that does not directly result in the startup of a business does not count towards businesses assisted.
3. For revolving loan funds, each ultimate recipient will be counted as a business assisted.

NOTE: The number you put under businesses to be assisted must be able to be verified. The businesses assisted must be a direct result of grant funding. Contractors on development projects, third-party suppliers, service contracts, and any third-party marketing and distribution enterprises will not count towards businesses assisted.
