Fiscal Year 2017 Oregon Progress Summary

In Fiscal Year 2017, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development provided **\$695 million** through loans, loan guarantees, and grants for strategic projects aligned with locally identified community and economic development plans to improve the economy and quality of life in rural Oregon.

Single Family Housing Programs

Rural Development

Rural Development helped more than 2,160 low-income rural Oregonians purchase, build, or repair their homes in FY 2017 through \$403 million in loans and loan guarantees and more than \$1.3 million in grants.

Multi-Family Housing Programs

In FY 2017, Rural Development invested \$1.5 million to preserve affordable rental housing in rural Oregon. With help from \$22 million in rental assistance, nearly 5,850 families living at USDA-financed apartments paid no more than 30 percent of their income on rent.


Business and Cooperative Programs

Rural Development supported Oregon's rural businesses in FY 2017 with \$165 million in loans and loan guarantees and \$1.4 million in grants for 76 projects contributing to business start-up and expansion, job creation and retention, adoption of renewable energy and energy efficiency improvements, increased revenue for rural business ventures, and strengthened access to capital.

Community Programs

During FY 2017, Rural Development invested \$13.8 million through loans and \$365,400 through grants in community facilities, including a health clinic, fire and police departments, and a city hall. Combined, these facilities serve nearly 19,500 rural Oregon residents.

Rural Development also invested \$17 million through loans and \$9.2 million through grants in seven projects that will provide reliable, clean drinking water or waste disposal to more than 10,200 rural Oregon residents while maintaining reasonable rates.
