

HOW DOES USDA SUPPORT LOCAL AND REGIONAL FOOD SYSTEMS?

In 2009, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) launched the Know Your Farmer. Know Your Food Initiative (KYF2) to better support the farmers, ranchers, food businesses and communities engaged in local and regional food systems. Through a variety of grants, loans, and other resources, USDA is helping connect farmers and consumers at the local level and supporting every step of the supply chain in between.

The KYF2 initiative is a Departmentwide effort, channeling the strengths of USDA's seventeen agencies to revitalize rural economies, connect rural and urban communities, create jobs, and improve access to healthy food.

WHO DO WE HELP?

Whether you are a farmer looking to extend your growing season, a cooperative or entrepreneur building a food hub, a farmers market that wants to accept SNAP benefits, a school that needs cold storage to store locally procured meat, or a local government or nonprofit supporting these efforts, KYF2 can help you identify the right federal resources for the job. WHAT HAVE WE DONE?

Since KYF2 launched in 2009, USDA has invested more than \$800 million in local food systems, supporting more than 29,000 local food projects across the country. We've seen SNAP redemption at farmers markets rise from \$4 million in 2009 to over \$18 million by 2014. And between 2013-14 alone, USDA made over 500 investments in local food infrastructure, including processing facilities, cold storage, food hubs, and more. This is all part of USDA's commitment to strengthening local economies through agriculture.
