Coastal Barrier Resources System

Projects located within the John H. Chafee Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) cannot qualify for federal funding. In Texas, this applies to portions of all the barrier islands along the Gulf of Mexico and portions of some coastline along the interior bays. There are some allowable funding areas on the barrier islands and a review of a map would be required to identify these limited areas.

From the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) web page, the CBRS currently includes 585 System units, which comprise nearly 1.3 million acres of land and associated aquatic habitat. There are also 271 "otherwise protected areas," a category of coastal barriers already held for conservation purposes that include an additional 1.8 million acres of land and associated aquatic habitat.






The link above will open up the USFWS Coastal Barrier Resources Act map home page. To make a copy of the Texas Locater Map, click on the word link, "Texas" located on the right side of the page in the state grid area. A new window will open and it will ask you if you want to open, save, or cancel the map. Recommend that you save the map as a PDF to your computer for future reference, printing, or editing.

The Texas map is at a small scale, but can be used to identify the official CBRS unit maps within the State (colored in red). From the map, you can also find the areas that would qualify for federal funding (non red areas).

To create a specific CBRS unit map, obtain the specific unit number(s) from the Texas map. From the main web page noted above, scroll down and click the, "Click here to access the Official CBRS maps". A new window will open to the list of maps available in alphabetical State order. Scroll down as Texas is near the bottom of the page. Identify the unit you need by the unit number(s) and then click on the <u>pdf</u> link on the right hand side of the page. The map will load and a dialog box will open and to ask you if you want to open, save, or cancel the map. Recommend that you save the map as a PDF to your computer for future reference, printing, or editing
