High speed online connections will establish online city services to benefit the residents, including the remote monitoring of water resources, and a Web presence to assist with economic development efforts. The community will have access to computer training and education in e-commerce; students will have access to distance learning programs and enhanced curricula. The project's technology includes the wireless broadband equipment, which uses unlicensed radio spectrum. Barking Wind will establish a wireless backhaul connection for Internet connectivity in addition to a T1 connection.

Minco is located in Gray County, Oklahoma. One of the main goals of bringing broadband service to the community is the need for high-speed communications to detect and warn against tornadoes. Local officials believe "real time" information on weather could result in increasing the warning time before a tornado 1000 percent. The Minco Fire department and other emergency service providers have been desperately looking for a way to improve effectiveness in tornado alerts. In addition, the community suffers from a tough, agricultural based, agriculture economy. Global access, improved literacy and enhanced economic opportunities, individual and community challenges for the town and the county. The community connect center of opportunity will offer a significant first step as a magnet for opportunity, entrepreneurship and connectivity. Critical community organizations participating in this project include the Minco City Hall, the police department, the fire department the Minco Public School, along with the Community Center.

Establishment of an e-business and economic development Web-based capabilities to enable businesses to reach beyond the local community will be accomplished as well as enhancement of city services (Water, Fire/Rescue and City Administration). Additional employment will be realized for the town for operating the community center.
