ReConnect Rural Broadband Program

USDA has extended application deadlines for the Rural eConnectivity Pilot Program (ReConnect Program). USDA is pushing back the first application deadline to May 31, 2019, to give potential applicants adequate time to access technical assistance from USDA staff and its partners.

The new application deadlines are:

- May 31 for grants;
- June 21 for 50/50 loan/grant combinations;
- July 12 for low-interest loans.

Through the ReConnect Program, USDA is making available approximately \$200 million for grants, as well as \$200 million for loan and grant combinations, and \$200 million for low-interest loans. Funds will be awarded to projects that have financially sustainable business models that will bring high-speed broadband to rural homes, businesses, farms, ranches and community facilities such as first responders, health care sites and schools.

USDA Prioritizes Investments in Telemedicine to Address Rural Opioid Crisis

SDA is giving funding priority in the Distance Learning and Telemedicine (DLT) Grant program to address opioid misuse in rural communities.

The DLT program helps rural communities use the unique capabilities of telecommunications to connect to each other and to the world, overcoming the effects of remoteness and low population density. For example, this program can link teachers and medical service providers in one area to students and patients in another.

USDA may award up to 30 special consideration points for DLT program applications for projects that provide opioid treatment services in 220 at-risk counties identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The deadline for these applications is April 15, 2019.

USDA may award 10 special consideration points for opioid-related DLT projects or for those that provide Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) education as their primary purpose.



The application deadline for these projects is May 15, 2019.

USDA and HHS Partner to Create Recovery Housing in Rural Communities

SDA and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) will partner to create addiction recovery transitional housing in rural communities.

USDA and HHS formalized their partnership through an official Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Nonprofit organizations will be able to purchase homes from USDA and convert them to transitional housing for people recovering from opioid misuse.

USDA Rural Development and HHS Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)

will coordinate efforts to sell USDA's Real Estate Owned (REO) single-family housing properties at a discount to non-profit organizations that provide housing, treatment, job training and other key services for people in substance misuse treatment and recovery.

This will further enhance the two organizations' formal collaboration. It began in 2018 with SAMHSA's supplementing of USDA Cooperative Extension grants to expand technical assistance and training on opioid use disorder prevention and treatment.

Rural Economic Development Innovation (REDI) initiative

USDA and four of its partners are accepting applications from rural communities and regions for technical assistance to implement economic development planning projects as part of the Rural Economic Development Innovation (REDI) Initiative.

USDA is partnering with the National Association of Counties, Rural Community Assistance Partnership, McClure Engineering Company, and Purdue University Extension/Community & Economic Development Initiative of Kentucky.

Successful applicants will receive free technical assistance to develop and implement rural economic development plans.

Rural communities with 50,000 or fewer people are eligible to apply. Applications will be scored, reviewed and selected on a competitive basis. Interested parties can learn more about this initiative during a webinar on Tuesday, Feb. 12, 2019, at 1:00 PM EST.
