Success Stories

Distance Learning Grant Expands Eductional Opportunities

In Ohio's Ashtabula County, Jefferson School District is using its \$1 million Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grant to expand educational opportunities, reduce absenteeism, and increase access to telemedicine and behavioral health services, including substance use disorder counseling. Grant funds are offsetting the cost of equipment to set up six hub and end-user sites, each able to provide one-on-one or group classes and provide behavioral health or telemedicine services with regional providers. New Mental Health Service Center in Pennsylvania

With funding from a \$1 million Community Facilities direct loan, a new mental health service center in Uniontown, Pennsylvania offers a place to connect with qualified Fayette County Mental Health Association professionals. The center also will host community activities such as bingo and arts and crafts, not only expanding access to care, but also working to reduce the stigma often associated with seeking help for mental health challenges.
