SUBJECT: Availability-Based Project Waiver of American Iron and Steel Requirements for six-inch double check valve backflow preventer assemblies for the Eastern Iowa Regional Utility Service Systems' Droessler Subdivision Water System Improvements Project in Dubuque County, IA

Decision: The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is hereby granting an availability-based project-specific waiver of American Iron and Steel (AIS) requirements to the Eastern Iowa Regional Utility Service Systems for the purchase of one (1x) six-inch double check valve backflow preventer assembly in Dubuque County, IA. This waiver permits the use of non-domestic double check valve backflow preventer assemblies because no known domestic manufacturers can deliver a product that meets the project's technical specifications.

This is a project-specific waiver which applies only to the use of the specified product for the referenced project funded by the USDA Rural Development (RD) Rural Utilities Service (RUS) Water and Waste Disposal (WWD) Loan and Grant program under the Water and Environmental Programs (WEP). Any other project that wishes to use the same product must submit a separate waiver request based on the specific project circumstances.

Rationale: The AIS provision of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 (Public Law 115-31) and subsequent statutes require WEP assistance recipients to use domestic iron and steel products unless RD determines that it is necessary to waive this requirement. USDA has the authority to issue waivers in accordance with section 746 (b)(2) of P.L.115-31, which states in part: "[the requirements] shall not apply in any case or category of cases in which the Secretary of Agriculture ... or the designee of the Secretary finds that ... iron and steel products are not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities and of a satisfactory quality." As per the delegation memo of July 2017, approval of project specific waivers has been delegated to the Engineering and Environmental Staff Director.

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Background of Waiver Request: The Eastern Iowa Regional Utility Service Systems' Droessler Subdivision Water System Improvements project in Dubuque County, IA, includes installation of backflow prevention valve assemblies in their water system. The contractor stated that they could not find a manufacturer to furnish an assembly that adhered to AIS requirements, and furnished documentation from three suppliers corroborating this.

USDA RD had earlier been made aware of the lack of AIS-compliant backflow preventers regarding projects in Edgar, NE, Bartholomew, IN, Elizabeth, MN and Murdock, MN. In each case, the applicants reached out to multiple manufacturers or distributors, who all stated that they cannot supply backflow preventers meeting domestic preference requirements. USDA's AIS contractor then contacted multiple manufacturers and suppliers, including those contacted by the applicants. Of the companies that responded, none of them manufacture backflow preventer assemblies meeting both the project specifications and domestic preference requirements. Based on this research, USDA previously granted waivers for each of these projects for backflow preventer assemblies.

Eastern Iowa Regional Utility Service Systems submitted to RD a formal request to waive AIS requirements for the assemblies on September 12, 2023. Per statutory requirement, the waiver request was posted on RD's AIS website for a 15-day public comment period, and the Agency received no comments.

Finding: USDA is granting an availability-based waiver from the AIS requirements to the Eastern Iowa Regional Utility Service Systems one (1x) six-inch double check valve backflow preventer assembly. This waiver permits the purchase of these assemblies using WEP funds for the Droessler Subdivision Water System Improvements Project as documented in the waiver request submittal.

Legal Authority: Legal authority for the AIS requirements for WEP projects is included under the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 and subsequent statutes, under the authority of section 746 (b)(2) of P.L.115-31.
