**Errol General Store**

NH CDFA and USDA awarded the Errol General Store with more than \$23,000 to help rebuild after a devastating fire in January '21. Funds will be used for insulation, LED lighting and energy-efficient refrigeration, saving the store \$7,500/yr. with a 29% reduction in consumption.

**Road Hawg BBQ & Swine Dining**

\$18,000 in combined funding helped this popular restaurant make energy-smart improvements including new insulation, weather stripping and a more efficient HVAC system and water heater. Over \$5,300/yr. in savings is enough to power the equivalent of five homes.



**Gorham**

**Patrick's Pub & Eatery**

Voted the "Best Irish Pub" by the New Hampshire Magazine's 2020 Reader Poll, this forward-thinking restaurant used \$33,500 in funding to install a 49.2Kw solar array, replacing 62% of usage to save \$6,200 a year.



**Gilford**

**Goosebay Sawmill & Lumber**

With help from \$47,500 in grants, two roof-mounted solar arrays will save the business over \$9,000/yr. in energy costs. The 78.2kW system generates enough power for current and future needs.



**Chichester**

**Wilkins Lumber Co**

Opened in 1808, Wilkins Lumber is one of the oldest family-run sawmills in the Northeast. The company will use \$10,500 in grant funding for an LED lighting retrofit and power quality improvements, cutting \$3,900/yr. in energy costs while saving time and money from equipment maintenance.

This 90 year-old building will receive new heat pumps, insulation and windows with help from nearly \$18,000 in grants. 42% of saved energy offsets the electricity needs of 6 homes.
