

Mental Health in Rural America

The Challenge

Healthy rural communities include access to behavioral health care and promote community support for mental health. Rural Americans sometimes face logistical and other challenges that impact access and increase their risk of experiencing adverse mental health events. For example, last year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported that between 2000 – 2020, the rates of suicide in nonmetropolitan areas increased at almost twice the rate in metropolitan areas.

Success Stories

Turtle Mountain Recovery Center

In 2022, the USDA Rural Development (RD) Community Facilities Guaranteed Loan Program provided a \$10 million guarantee supporting construction of a nearly \$19 million, culturally-based substance use disorder treatment center for the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa in Belcourt, North Dakota. The Turtle Mountain Recovery Center eventually will expand to offer comprehensive behavioral health care services to the Turtle Mountain Reservation. The Center is expected to open this fall.

Gunnison Valley Hospital and the Utah Department of Corrections

In FY23, USDA RD invested \$1.7 million to expand telehealth services – specifically, behavioral and mental health – in rural Utah. The funding helped purchase telehealth carts and related equipment to deliver mental health care – including substance and opioid use disorder – in 10 locations serving 20 Utah counties using a hub-and-spoke model. Telehealth allows residents to travel shorter distances to access care, and connects medical specialists to patients who otherwise wouldn't have access.
