What does this program do?

USDA Rural Development

This program helps qualified nonprofits create a revolving loan fund and to issue subgrants to improve access to safe, reliable drinking water in rural areas. It also helps improve the sanitary conditions caused by inadequate or failing septic systems.

What is an eligible area?

Rural Decentralized Water Systems Grant Program

Who can apply?

Private nonprofits that have:

- Expertise and experience promoting the safe, productive use of individually-owned household water well systems or decentralized wastewater systems
- · Legal authority to act as a lender
- Sufficient expertise and experience in conducting and managing lending activities
- Financial, technical, and managerial ability to comply with relevant federal and state laws and regulations

How can grant funds be used?

Grant funds can be used to create a revolving loan fund or to issue subgrants. The sub-grants or loans may be used to build, refurbish, or service individually-owned household water well and decentralized wastewater systems such as a septic system.

When ground well water contamination is documented, funds may also be used to complete work within the residence to address the contamination.

Terms for a loan issued by the nonprofit must include a 1 percent, fixed interest rate over a maximum 20-year term, and a \$15,000 loan limit per household. The maximum amount per subgrant is \$15,000.

Are matching funds required for the grant?

Yes. The nonprofit must contribute at least 10 percent. Matching funds can come from the nonprofit applicant or an eligible third party, but cannot be in-kind contributions.
