The area to be served has suffered from out migration of its population and consolidation of farmsteads. BEK already provides advanced services to over 7,000 homes within 65 miles of the service area and is well suited to extend its existing services to this needy area. BEK will use RUS funding to deploy broadband service using Fiber to the Home (FTTH) technology. The project will bring high-speed broadband capabilities to customers who otherwise have no broadband or lesser quality services such as dial-up, satellite or wireless services, all of which offer speeds below 3 Mbps (upload and download speeds combined) and lack the ability to deliver real-time services like IP Voice and IP Video. The proposed fiber network will introduce new capabilities not found today in these rural community's educational, healthcare and public safety

institutions.
