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

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Attachment 2 – Figure 1. Project Vicinity Map (7.5 minute Quadrangle Map)


Preliminary Notice of Possible Impact on Important Resources

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The USDA, Rural Development is considering an application for loan guarantee pursuant to Section 9003 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 received from Coskata Inc. 4575 Weaver Parkway, Suite 100, Warrenville, IL 60555, for constructing and operating a Cellulosic Ethanol Facility in Boligee, Green County, Alabama. The facility would include the construction of the facility and related infrastructure to be located within the Crossroads of America Industrial Port and Park, specifically on approximately 151 acres within S13, T21N, R1W of the Boligee 7.5 Minute Quadrangle Map.

If implemented, the proposal may directly affect up to 23 acres of low quality wetland and up to 151 acres of prime farmland and potentially impact adjacent floodplains and/or cultural resources within the site. A permit is being submitted to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the proposed wetland impact and includes a proposal for mitigation in the form of wetland restoration and enhancement on a forty five-acre parcel of land in the same 12-digit hydrologic unit within the industrial park. Floodplain impact would be limited to minor impacts for access roads to the site. A Phase I archeological study is currently being completed on the site to determine if any cultural resources are present. The purpose of this notice is to inform interested parties and the public, of possible impacts to wetland, floodplains or cultural resources and to request comments concerning the proposal; any site or design alternatives; and, any methods that would avoid or minimize the impact to such important resources.





Ingredients

2 (9 inch) pie shell 3 tablespoons cornstarch 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon

1 (12 fluid ounce) can unsweetened apple juice concentrate, thawed

6 cups sliced green apples

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

In a small bowl whisk together cornstarch, cinnamon, and 1/3 cup of the apple juice concentrate. Set aside.

In a large saucepan simmer apples with remaining apple juice concentrate until apples are tender, about 10 minutes. Stir in cornstarch mixture and continue to simmer until thickened. Remove from heat.

Spoon apple mixture into pastry-lined pie plate. Cover with top crust. Seal and flute edges. Cut steam vents in top.

Bake in preheated oven for 45 minutes, or until crust is golden brown.


Christ is in You

BBB warns car shoppers about online dealer scam

ARLINGTON, VA - Better Business Bureau is warning car shoppers to beware of websites offering too-good-to-be-true deals on repossessed cars. BBB has heard from people across the country who thought they were buying from a reputable dealer online but were actually sending money to scammers posing as legitimate, already-established community dealerships.

"Because scammers essentially steal the identity and good name of real auto dealers, car shoppers will think that they're buying a car from a reputable business," said Stephen A. Cox, President and CEO of the Council of Better Business Bureaus. "The truth is, they're being sold a bill of goods by a coordinated, agile and in all likelihood overseas outfit of scammers."

Most recently, one Memphis auto dealer, America Auto Sales received more than 1,000 calls from consumers across the country who had shopped for a new car on www. americautosales.com thinking that it was the website of the Memphis dealership. The phony website used the name, address and contact information of the real dealer.

The fraudulent website claimed to sell repossessed cars at prices well below market. Buyers were instructed to wire a deposit—as much as \$5,000—to an individual rather than the company, which, according to the phony website, "helps us avoid taxes legally." The balance was to be paid upon delivery at the consumer's address within five days.

After paying the deposit, victims called the real dealership to arrange delivery of their car. Some customers even showed up at the lot to pick up the cars they had "bought" on the bogus site.

BBB recommends that car shoppers look for the following red flags when shopping for a car online: The prices are too good to be true. The dealer only communicates through chat or e-mail—never by phone. The dealer only accepts payment by money wire transfer.
