**Application Cycle Open**: The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development invites applications to compete for fiscal year 2020 (FY20) funding for the Rural Business Development Grant (RBDG) program. Please note program funds are not available at this time, however USDA Rural Development anticipates level program funding for FY20. If there are any changes to funding, USDA Rural Development will notify applicants.

Eligible applicants for grant funds include non-profits, municipalities, development corporations, and state agencies.

The RBDG program funds two types of eligible projects:

**<u>Rural Business Enterprise Activities:</u>** Rural Business Enterprise Grants (RBEG) funds may be used for the acquisition and development of land, easements and rights-of-way; construction or repairs of buildings, machinery, equipment, roadways, utilities, and pollution control and abatement facilities; provision of loans for startup operating cost and working capital; professional services necessary for project planning and development; establishment of a revolving loan fund; development or operation of rural distance learning networks and/or programs for adult students; technical assistance for small and emerging businesses; technical assistance and training to rural communities related to passenger transportation services; loan participations.

**<u>Rural Business Opportunity Activities:</u>** Rural Business Opportunity Grant (RBOG) funds may be used for the identification and analysis of business opportunities that will use local rural materials or human resources (including feasibility and business plan studies); technical assistance or leadership development training to rural entrepreneurs and managers; establish business support centers; conduct local or multi-county economic development planning; establish training centers which provide training to rural businesses in the utilization of interactive communication technologies to develop international trade and markets; pay fees and charges for professional services necessary to conduct technical assistance, training, or planning functions.

<u>Please note:</u> USDA Rural Development anticipates making approximately six grants using this notice. Due to limited statewide funding, applications of \$30,000 or less are encouraged.

USDA Rural Development requires potential applicants to submit Letters of Intent (LOI) to review eligibility and to provide timely feedback on an application's competitiveness for funding. LOI's must be received by USDA Rural Development no later than 4:30 pm on Friday, January 17, 2020. Emailed LOI's will be accepted.

<u>Application Deadline:</u> Complete applications must be received by USDA Rural Development no later than 4:30 pm on Tuesday March 31, 2020.

- If an indirect cost rate will be used, a copy of your approved indirect cost rate with all approval documentation must be submitted with the application.
- Applications may be submitted via Email or hard copy and must be received by COB (4:30pm) on Tuesday, March 31st.
- All application documentation, including verification of match funds, must have required signatures on all forms.
- Electronic signatures on emailed applications will be accepted. Submission of hard copy applications require original Ink signatures.
- Incomplete applications <u>will not</u> compete for funding.
- Applications will not be accepted after 4:30pm, Tuesday, March 31, 2020. This includes emailed applications
