The collaborative will help build an entrepreneurial ecosystem and economy in the region by providing technical assistance to local entrepreneurs. Oregon RAIN will provide entrepreneurs with workshops, pre-launch business development, seminars and training, a mentoring program, referrals, and financial resources. In addition, the nonprofit will host a "pitch-fest" featuring start-ups introducing its business concepts. In the first year, this project will culminate in a user survey and case study, with the intention of continuing the program in subsequent years.
