2-B. Project Description: PRIDE Network proposes to construct a FTTP telecommunications infrastructure, with a WiMAX service-extension overlay, that will bring advanced broadband services to rural communities in the Texas South Plains region. The network will initially offer synchronous data speeds of 1 to 100 Mbps with the ability to increase to even higher speeds to ensure the greatest broadband benefits possible.

8. Infrastructure Projects Executive Summary

By this application, PRIDE Network, Inc. ("PRIDE Net") requests the Federal assistance needed to build a \$44.6 million fiber-to-the-premises open-access telecommunications infrastructure, with a wireless broadband service-extension overlay, that will make affordable Advanced Broadband service available to (b) (4) rural communities in Texas. NTS Communications, Inc. ("NTS") proposes, through its recently formed subsidiary, PRIDE Net, to construct and operate the Plains Regional Inter-County Data Enterprise fiber optic cable and broadband wireless network in the Texas South Plains region.

The network will also directly enable cost-effective applications of broadband services, including: First Responder Interoperability, E911 Services Distance Learning, Telemedicine, Advanced Broadband Internet Connectivity to Underserved Communities, Full Featured Video Services, Fail-Safe Disaster Recovery Services, and Economic Development Opportunities.

The topics required to be addressed in the Executive Summary by the Application Form are discussed in detail below.



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a) Opportunity the proposed system seeks to address.

Most of the communities that will be served by PRIDE Net do not currently have any form of Advanced Broadband service, and such service is not affordable to most of the people that reside in those communities, including those that have lost their jobs during the current financial crisis and need the advantages that Advanced Broadband services can provide in finding a job. Where broadband service is available, PRIDE Net will offer a competitive choice that will be far more affordable.

b) A general description of the proposed funded service areas (location, number of communities, etc.).

The PRIDE network will make affordable Advanced Broadband services available to the following communities in Texas: New Deal, Abernathy, Hale Center, Ropesville, Meadow, Slaton, Lamesa, Brownfield, Littlefield, Whitharral, Wilson and Plainview. The PRIDE network will be extended to additional communities not listed above that also lack access to affordable Advanced Broadband service as profits are reinvested in new infrastructure construction. In this way, by first using federal grant/loan dollars to build the core of the network and its initial passings, and then by allowing future profits to further expand network growth, PRIDE Net will create a continuous benefit cycle to the entire region for generations to come.

PRIDE Net has entered into informal collaborative arrangements with seven community anchor institutions. Institutions involved with the development and future use of the network are as follows: South Plains Association of Governments, Lubbock County, South Plains College, Region XVII Educational Service Center, Texas Tech Univ. Health Sciences Center, NW Texas Small Business Dev. Center, and WorkForce Solutions – South Plains. Additionally, a collaborative arrangement with South Plains Electric Cooperative to leverage a potential ARRA Department of Energy "Smart Grid" grant application will be defined – dependant on the success of the respective party's funding applications. NTS, through its subsidiary, PRIDE Net is fully capable of constructing and operating the PRIDE network in a competent manner in compliance with all applicable Federal, state, and local laws. NTS Communications, Inc. was formed in 1981 and achieved competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") status in 1999. NTS operates as a wholly owned subsidiary of Xfone, Inc. (NYSE Alternext: "XFN"). NTS is headquartered in Lubbock, Texas and with its staff of 300-plus employees, provides a full range of wireline voice and data services to customers in Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. Acting in a management capacity, NTS also directs the business and service delivery of its sister company, Xfone USA, Inc., which provides a full range of similar voice and data services to customers in Louisiana and Mississippi. Since 2004, NTS has engaged in an aggressive build-out of FTTP networks in Lubbock, Wolfforth, and Woodrow, Texas. To date, NTS has constructed

17. Methodology for Area Status:

Rural Area Definition

PRIDE Net has performed an analysis of the one proposed BIP funded Service Area within the state of Texas that is included in this ARRA funding application for a Last Mile Non-Remote project. It has been determined that the Last Mile Service Area can be considered as 93% Rural by the definitions provided in the BIP application documentation. Only one of the census designated communities has a population over 20,000 according to the 2000 US Census and can be considered 93% rural. This satisfies the BIP requirement that at least 75% of the proposed Service Areas in a Last Mile Non-Remote project be defined as Rural Areas.

Underserved Definition

Data from the "Current Population Survey (October 2007)", prepared by the United States Bureau of Census indicated that rural Texas households had an average Broadband Subscribership rate of only 36.62%. This is less than the 40% threshold set in the BIP application documentation and therefore indicates that rural Texas communities are underserved as per the ARRA definition. Due to the fact that the lowest speed considered as broadband in 2007 was 200 kbps, it can be reasonably projected that if the new broadband definition requires a minimum of 768 kbps, the actual Broadband Subscribership percentage for rural Texas would be much lower, thereby more firmly establishing the Underserved nature of these communities.

To confirm the findings of the United States Bureau of Census, PRIDE Net performed 628 inperson market surveys within the proposed Last Mile Service Areas. The analysis of these market surveys confirmed that the actual Broadband Subscribership averaged 34%, which is less than the 40% Broadband Subscribership threshold required in the ARRA program and serves to allow a definition of Underserved for the proposed Last Mile Service Areas. After completing the competitive analysis that is included in Attachment C, PRIDE Net also utilized



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the online tools of the incumbents, to the extent that they were available, to enter in physical addresses of residents to confirm that those addresses did not qualify under the incumbents own database for DSL or Cable modem service. These outcomes supported the survey results and provided further evidence of the Underserved nature of the proposed service area. It was especially evident as residents expressed their discord with lack of competition in these communities.

As a result, the combined data from the US Census "Current Population Study (October 2007)" and the market surveys performed by PRIDE Net gives evidence that the proposed Last Mile Service Area can be defined as Underserved. This more than meets the ARRA requirement that a Last Mile Non-Remote project service area must be able to be defined as at least 75% Unserved or Underserved and confirms that the PRIDE Net proposed Last Mile Service Area is eligible for BIP funding.






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

Federal License or Approval Required:

FCC License – Need 3650-3700 MHz band Wireless Broadband Service (WiMAX) license from the FCC. Application has been filed with the FCC for a nationwide non-exclusive WiMAX license, and that application is currently being processed by the FCC.

Environmental Assessments – Environmental Assessments ("EAs") may need to be filed with the FCC for approval for tower sites for compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act and the National Historic Preservation Act. Whether EAs need to be required to depend on where the WiMAX stations and antennas will ultimately be located. Consultant is ready to prepare the appropriate EA report (including all necessary filings and notifications required to be submitted to state officials and Native American tribes) for submission to the FCC should the funding application be approved; FCC counsel is ready to assist in filing of the EA applications should the funding application be approved.



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State Licenses or Approvals Required:

Environmental Impact – State Historic Preservation Officer ("SHPO") consultation is required regarding the potential impact on historical sites. Consultant is ready to prepare the appropriate consultation notices to the Texas SHPO should the funding application be approved.

Local Construction Permits: Local construction permits will be required on an as-needed basis in order to construct the system. PRIDE Net is ready to file for the appropriate construction permits should the funding application be approved.

Utility Pole Attachment Agreement: Agreements with utility pole owners are required before attachments can be made to existing poles. PRIDE Net is ready to complete agreements should the funding application be approved.

Service Provider Certificate of Operating Authority (SPCOA): This is a license issued by the Texas Public Utility Commission to provide facilities-based telecommunications service in Texas. Application for SPCOA has been filed with the Texas Public Utilities Commission (TPUC) and is currently pending.

Statewide Video Franchise Authority: A statewide video franchise is needed in order to provide video service in Texas. Statewide Video Franchise Authority will be filed with the TPUC upon funding approval and the TPUC must, by law, grant said approval within 10 days.

As you are aware, the South Plains Association of Governments ("SPAG") is a Council of Governments designated by the Governor of Texas and charged with improving the quality of life for all citizens living in the South Plains region of Texas by enhancing the capabilities of local governments and community organizations to respond to constituent needs. The Emergency Responders Advisory Committee within SPAG is developing a long-range plan for improving first-responder resources and capabilities, and NTS Communication's PRIDE Network proposal is particularly timely and relevant to assist in fulfilling SPAG's mission critical role of augmenting and improving public safety.

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center's (TTUHSC) F. Marie Hall Institute for Rural and Community Health educates health care providers, enhances access to health care, and contributes to a better quality of life for residents in West Texas. Three of the leading determinants of poor health – racial/ethnic minority status, geographic isolation, and poverty – can be found throughout the region. An economical way to overcome those challenges and disseminate health related information and care to needy rural community members is to leverage broadband access to enable them to receive the services they need either at home, or at community Internet access points, such as libraries or local education centers. It does not include (i) any revenue not actually received, even if billed, such as bad debt, or (ii) any tax or fee of general applicability imposed by a city, state, federal, or any other governmental entity and required to be collected by PRIDE and remitted to the entity.



4. <u>Conditions Precedent and Rights Prior to Commencement Date.</u>

(a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, this Agreement shall not be effective unless, and the Commencement Date shall be delayed until Licensee obtains all governmental licenses, permits and approvals required of Licensee for its use of the Premises, including zoning, — variances, administrative or special use permits (collectively referred to as "Governmental Approvals"); provided that Licensee shall have the right, but not the obligation to appeal a denial of a Governmental Approval, and the Commencement Date shall be extended until a final decision is rendered which is not subject of any further appeal. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, if the approval process is not completed six (6) months from the execution of this Agreement, Licensee must commence payment of the License Fee to hold Licensee's Premises. Licensor agrees to cooperate with Licensee and join in any application for Governmental Approvals, provided, however, that Licensor shall be reimbursed by Licensee for any of Licensor's reasonable out-of-pocket costs associated with the foregoing within thirty (30) days of Licensee's receipt of an itemized statement of such costs together with all supporting documentation;

- (b) The parties further agree that prior to the Commencement Date; the Licensee shall have the following rights and remedies:
 - (i) the right to obtain a title report or commitment for a title policy from a title insurance company of its choice. If, in the reasonable opinion of the Licensee, such title report shows any defects of title or liens or encumbrances which materially adversely affect Licensee's proposed use of the Site, Licensee shall notify Licensor of such defect and, at Licensor's sole option, Licensor shall undertake to remedy the defect or provide Licensee with a title policy with such defect removed or affirmatively insured over. In the event Licensor has not remedied the defect with sixty (60) days from notification by Licensee, Licensee has the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice to Licensor. No mortgage or unpaid general ad valorem or like taxes shall constitute a defect;
 - (ii) the right to have the Site surveyed and to have structural analyses performed. In the event that any defects are shown by the survey or the structural analyses, which in the reasonable opinion of Licensee may adversely affect Licensee's intended use of the Site, Licensee shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice to Licensor; and
 - (c) Failure to satisfy the conditions set forth in Section 4 (a) above, or Licensee's termination under Section 4 (b) above, shall relieve both parties of all obligations herein.
- 5. Licensee shall pay a license fee of and no/100 Dollars (\$ License Fee. month ("License Fee"), payable on the first day of the month, in advance, beginning on the Commencement Date. The License Fee for any partial month during the Term shall be pro-rated based on the number of days of the Term in said month, as applicable. The License Fee shall be mailed (or sent via electronic methods as agreed to by the parties in writing) to the address set out in the first paragraph hereof, or such other address as a party may, from time to time, designate in writing. If the License Fee is not paid within 30 days of its due date, Licensee will pay interest on the past due amounts at one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month. 6. <u>Tests and Construction</u>.

- (a) Upon prior written notice to Licensor, Licensee shall have the right at any time after the Effective Date to enter upon the Land to (i) make necessary engineering surveys, inspections, soil tests, borings, and other reasonably necessary tests, and (ii) construct the Facilities. At the request of Licensee, Licensor shall provide Licensee copies of all plans, specifications, surveys and tower maps for the Land or Tower in Licensor's possession or available to Licensor. Any expense related to copying such materials shall be paid by Licensee.
- (b) Licensor warrants that the Site (including the tower lighting systems) meets with all applicable rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, Federal Aviation Administration and all applicable codes and regulations of the city, county and state in which the Site is located. Licensor agrees to maintain the lighting system in proper operating condition and comply with all notice requirements of the Federal Aviation Administration regarding the failure, malfunction or repairs of the lighting systems. The cost of painting and repairing the Tower shall be borne by Licensor unless the damage to the Tower is caused by Licensee, in which case Licensor shall repair such damage and Licensee will reimburse Licensor for all costs and expenses incurred by Licensor in connection with such repair.
- 7. Facilities; Utilities; Access, Construction and Installation.

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- (a) Licensee, at its sole cost and expense, has the right to erect, maintain and operate on the Premises wireless, radio and related communication facilities, including utility lines, an air conditioned equipment shelter or cabinets, electronic equipment, radio transmitting and receiving antennas and supporting structures more fully described in Exhibit B1. All construction and installation shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner. The Facilities shall remain Licensee's personal property and are not fixtures. In the event any Tower modifications are required, regardless of type, such modifications are to be performed only with Licensor's prior written consent and at Licensee's sole cost and expense, and upon completion shall be considered a fixture and part of the Tower and Licensor's property.
- (b) Licensee shall draw electricity by separate utility service from any utility company that will provide service to the Site. Any easement necessary for power, telephone or other utilities will be located on the Site at a location acceptable to Licensor, the Licensee and the servicing utility company, acceptance not to be unreasonably withheld, delayed or conditioned by either Licensee or Licensor.
- (c) In the event of a loss of power, Licensee shall have the right to install a temporary emergency generator on the Land which it will remove within five (5) days of the end of the emergency need.
- (d) Licensee and its employees, agents and subcontractors may enter on or across the Land twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week, at no charge, to construct, install, operate, maintain and repair the Facilities.

8. Non-Interference.

- Licensor may allow others use the Site, provided it shall require such others ("New Licensee") to install equipment that will not interfere with Licensee's operations then being conducted from the Premises. In the event a New Licensee causes interference with the Facilities, Licensor will require the New Licensee to take all steps necessary to eliminate the interference. If such interference cannot be eliminated within forty-eight (48) hours, Licensor shall take such actions to cause such New Licensee to disconnect the electric power and shut down such New Licensee's interfering equipment (except for intermittent operation for the purpose of testing, after performing maintenance, repair, modification, replacement, or other action taken for the purpose of correcting such interference) until such interference is eliminated. If such interference is not eliminated to the reasonable satisfaction of Licensor within thirty (30) days after notice from Licensee, Licensor shall cause such New Licensee to remove the interfering equipment from the Site. Licensee agrees to reasonably cooperate with Licensor and any New Licensees to try to resolve any interference issues at the expense of the New Licensee.
- (b) If Licensees Facilities interfere with any existing equipment placed upon the Tower prior to the Effective Date, Licensee shall take all steps necessary to eliminate the interference. If such interference cannot be eliminated within forty-eight (48) hours after receipt by Licensee from Licensor of notice of the existence of interference, Licensee shall cease operation of the Facilities (except for intermittent operation for the purpose of testing, after performing maintenance, repair, modification, replacement, or other action taken for the purpose of correcting such interference) until such interference is eliminated. If such interference is not eliminated to the reasonable satisfaction of Licensor within thirty (30) days after receipt by Licensee of such notice from Licensor, Licensee shall remove the interfering equipment from the Site. Licensee shall not alter the operations of the Facilities or replace, upgrade or otherwise modify the Facilities in a manner which will cause interference with the operations of any other equipment which is then in existence on the Tower and for which Licensor has a written contractual agreement.
- 9. <u>Taxes</u>. Licensor shall pay all real property taxes it is obligated to pay for the Land and its improvements thereon. Licensee shall reimburse Licensor for any increases in real property taxes which are assessed as a direct result of Licensee's improvements to the Land. As a condition of Licensee's obligation to pay such tax increases, Licensor shall provide to Licensee the documentation from the taxing authority, reasonably acceptable to Licensee, indicating that the increase is due to Licensee's improvements.

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10. Default.

- (a) A party shall be in default if it materially breaches any of its representations or warranties or otherwise fails to perform any material duty or obligations and, except for a monetary default, does not cure or remedy such breach within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of same; provided, however, that, if such breach shall necessitate a longer period to cure than thirty (30) days, then such cure period shall be extended for such time as is reasonably necessary to cure such breach, but only so long as (i) such efforts to cure are commenced within fifteen (15) days of receipt of written notice from the non-defaulting party, and (ii) the defaulting party proceeds diligently and in good faith to effect a cure. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event of a monetary default the cure period is ten (10) day period from the date of receipt by the defaulting party of written notice of the default, nor shall the time within which a party may cure a failure in the performance of requirements regarding interference exceed a forty-eight (48) hour period or thirty (30) day period whichever may be applicable.
- (b) In addition, Licensee shall be in default under this License if it shall become bankrupt, insolvent or file a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, have an involuntary petition in bankruptcy filed against it which is not dismissed within sixty (60) days of the date of filing, if it files for reorganization or for the appointment of a receiver or if it makes an assignment for the benefit of its creditors;
- (c) Upon the occurrence of a default, the non-defaulting party may pursue any and all remedies available under applicable law. Venue shall be in Lyon County, KS.
- 11. <u>Termination</u>. Following the Commencement Date this License may be terminated by Licensee upon thirty (30) days prior written notice in the event that the Licensee is unable to obtain or maintain any Governmental Approval necessary for the construction or operation of the Facilities.
- 12. Removal of Equipment. Licensee shall surrender the Site at the expiration or early termination of this License and remove the Facilities and restore the Premises to substantially the same condition existing as of the Commencement Date, ordinary wear and tear, casualty, or acts of God, excepted. If Licensee has not completed its obligations on or before the sixtieth (60th) day following the expiration or early termination, Licensee shall be deemed to have abandoned the Facilities and Licensor may remove the Facilities and dispose of same in Licensor's sole discretion without accounting to Licensee for the value thereof.

13. Casualty and Condemnation.

- (a) In case of damage to a portion of the Site which is essential to the operation of the Facilities, by fire or other casualty, Licensor shall, at its expense, cause the damage to be repaired to a condition as nearly as practicable to that existing prior to the damage, with reasonable speed and diligence. Licensor shall not be required to repair any damage beyond the extent that insurance proceeds are inadequate to pay for such repairs. For the time that the Site is rendered unusable for Licensee's intended purpose, the License Fee shall proportionately abate. Licensee shall be permitted to terminate this License if the Premises have been rendered unusable for Licensee's intended purpose and Licensor's estimated period for completion of the repair and restoration exceeds one hundred twenty (120) days.
- (b) If the whole or any substantial part of the Site shall be taken by any public authority under the power of eminent domain so as to materially interfere with Licensee's use and occupancy of the Premises, then this License shall terminate as to the part of the Premises so taken, and the License Fee shall be reduced or abated in proportion to the actual reduction or abatement of use and/or operation of the Premises. Any License Fee paid in advance shall be refunded to Licensee, as appropriate, within thirty (30) days of Licensee's written demand. Licensee shall be entitled to pursue its interest under a separate claim. In the event that there is sufficient remaining space upon the Site, and with Licensor consent the Licensee may place a temporary communications facility upon the Site for a period of up to one (1) year after the termination at a rental rate equal to two-third (2/3) of the amount of the rental provided for herein.
- 14. <u>Indemnification</u>. Licensee agrees to compensate Licensor for damages and to indemnify and to hold Licensor harmless from all claims (including reasonable attorneys' fees, costs and expenses of defending against

Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, all property kept, installed, stored, or maintained in or upon the Site by Licensee shall be so installed, kept, stored, or maintained at Licensee's risk. - (a) The rights of Licensee under this Agreement may be assigned with the prior written consent of Licensor, said consent not to be unreasonably withheld or denied, except that Licensee may assign its rights and delegate its duties hereunder to any entity which directly controls, is controlled by, or is under common control of the Licensee or an entity that obtains control of Licensee during the term of this Agreement.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything else contained herein, Licensee may, without Licensor's consent, pledge, mortgage, convey by deed of trust, assign, create a security interest in, or otherwise execute and deliver any and all instruments for the purpose of securing indebtedness all or any portion of Licensee's interest in this Agreement, and/or all or any portion of Licensee's right, title, and interest in and to any and/or all of the Facilities. Promptly on Licensee's or Licensee's lender's request, Licensor shall execute and deliver, and shall assist in facilitating the execution and delivery of, all documents requested by any of Licensee's lenders including, but not limited to, waivers of Licensor's right to levy or distraint upon for License Fee any of Licensee's property given as security for a debt, acknowledgements that none of the Facilities shall become fixtures, consents to giving notice to Licensee's lender(s) in the event of Licensee's default under the provisions of this Agreement, consents to Licensee's assignment to any lender(s) of any and all of Licensee's interest in or to this Agreement and the Facilities and nondisturbance agreements from Licensor and Licensor's lenders.
- 16. Waiver of Lien. Licensee hereby waives any and all lien rights Licensee may have, statutory or otherwise, in and to the Site or any portion thereof, regardless of whether or not same is deemed real or personal property under applicable laws. Except as may be otherwise provided herein, Licensor hereby waives any and all lien rights Licensor may have, statutory or otherwise, in and to the Facilities or any portion thereof, regardless of whether or not same is deemed real or personal property under applicable laws.
- 17. Warranty of Title and Quiet Enjoyment. Licensor warrants that: (i) Licensor owns the Land or occupies the Land pursuant to an easement and owns and operates the Tower located thereon and has rights of access thereto; (ii) Licensor has full right to make and perform this Agreement; and (iii) Licensor covenants and agrees with Licensee that upon Licensee paying the License Fee and observing and performing all the terms, covenants and conditions on Licensee's part to be observed and performed, Licensee may peacefully and quietly enjoy the Premises.
- 18. Subordination. This License is and shall be subordinate to all mortgages, deeds of trust and similar security documents which may now or hereafter be secured by the Land, and to all renewals, modifications, consolidations and extensions thereof. This clause shall be self-operative and no further instrument of subordination shall be required by any mortgagee, but in confirmation of such subordination, Licensee shall execute, within ten (10) days after receipt of written request, any certificate that Licensor may reasonably require acknowledging such subordination. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Licensor shall use reasonable efforts to cause any party holding the instrument to which this License is subordinate,, in the event of any foreclosure sale or possessory action, to recognize and preserve this License, and, if permitted in such case, this License shall continue in full force and effect and Licensee shall attorn to such party and shall execute, acknowledge and deliver any instrument, in a form reasonably acceptable to Licensee, that has for its purpose and effect the confirmation of such attornment. - (b) Licensor, at Licensor's sole cost and expense, shall maintain the Site and its improvements thereto in good order and repair, ordinary and reasonable wear and tear, damage by fire, the elements and other casualty excepted and in substantial compliance with all laws, codes, regulations and orders of any governmental or regulatory entity. Damage resulting from the negligent acts or omissions of Licensee, shall be repaired by Licensee, at Licensee's cost and expense unless otherwise provided herein.
- 20. Mechanics Liens. Licensor and Licensee expressly acknowledge and agree that neither Licensee nor any one claiming by, through or under Licensee, including without limitation contractors, sub-contractors, materialmen, mechanics and laborers, shall have any right to file or place any mechanics' or materialmen's liens of any kind whatsoever upon the Site nor upon any building or improvement thereon. All parties with whom Licensee may deal are hereby put on notice that Licensee has no power to subject Licensor's interest in the Site to any claim or lien of any kind or character and any persons dealing with Licensee must look solely to the credit of Licensee for payment and not to Licensor's interest in the Site or otherwise. Licensee shall allow Licensor to post notices of non-responsibility on the Premises. Licensee agrees to allow such notices to remain posted in the Site throughout the construction period and to notify Licensor if such notices are damaged or removed. Licensor represents, warrants and agrees (1) that neither Licensor nor, to Licensor's knowledge, any third party has used, generated, stored or disposed of, or permitted the use, generation, storage or disposal of, any Hazardous Material on, under, about or within the Site in violation of any law of regulation except, as disclosed to Licensee in any environmental reports provided to Licensee and (2) that Licensor will not generate, store or dispose of any Hazardous Material on, under, about or within the Site in violation of any law or regulation. Licensor and Licensee each agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other and the other's partners, affiliates, agents and employees against any and all losses, liabilities, claims and/or costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs) arising from any breach of any representation, warranty or agreement contained in this Section. As used in this Section, "Hazardous Material" shall mean petroleum or any petroleum product, asbestos, any substance known by the state in which the Site is located to cause cancer and/or reproductive toxicity, and/or any substance, chemical or waste that is identified as hazardous, toxic or dangerous in any applicable federal, state or local law or regulation. This Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

(a) This License constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all offers, negotiations and other agreements concerning the subject matter contained herein. Any amendments to this License must be in writing and executed by both parties.

(b)	If any provision of this License is invalid or unenforceable with respect to any party, the
remainder of this	License or the application of such provision to persons other than those as to whom it is
held invalid or un	enforceable, shall not be affected and each provision of this License shall be valid and
enforceable to the	fullest extent permitted by law.

- (c) This License shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the successors and permitted assignees of the respective parties.
- (d) Any notice or demand required to be given herein shall be made by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, or recognized overnight courier which provides proof of delivery, to the address of the respective parties set forth in the first paragraph. Licensor or Licensee may from time to time designate any other address for this purpose by written notice to the other party. All notices hereunder shall be deemed received upon actual receipt or rejection.
- (e) This License shall be governed by the laws of the State of where the Site is located without regard to the principles of conflict of laws thereunder.
- (f) Licensor acknowledges that a Memorandum of Agreement in the form annexed hereto as Exhibit C may be recorded by Licensee, at Licensee's option and expense, in the official records of the County where the Land is located.
- (g) In any case where the approval or consent of one party hereto is required, requested or otherwise to be given under this License, such approval or consent shall not be unreasonably conditioned, delayed, or withheld.
- (h) All Exhibits may be executed in duplicate counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.
- (j) Notwithstanding anything in this License to the contrary, each party hereby waives any claim that they may have against the other party with respect to any consequential, punitive, special or incidental damage or lost profits.

The Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) files this final recommendation regarding the August 3, 2009, filing by PRIDE Network, Inc. (Applicant) applying under § 54.151 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act for approval of a Service Provider Certificate of Operating Authority (SPCOA) to provide facilitiesbased telecommunications services within the geographic area of the entire State of Texas.

I. PURA/Substantive Rule Requirements

Pursuant to PURA §54.154(b)(3), the applicant must demonstrate that it has the technical ability to provide the requested services and that the services meet the requirements of PURA §§54.151 - 54.159. Additionally, the applicant must demonstrate compliance with the customer protection requirements of P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.111(c)(2)(F). Finally the applicant must establish that it has met the financial qualifications outlined in PURA §54.154(b)(3) and P.U.C. SUBST, R. 26.111(c) and (d).

II. Staff Analysis

Staff has examined the applicant's SPCOA application to determine if it meets the requirements of PURA §§54.151 - 54.159 and P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.111. Gordon Van Sickle of the Commission's Infrastructure Reliability Division reviewed the application to determine whether it meets the technical requirements of PURA § 54.154(b)(3) and PURA §§ 54.151 - 54.159 and the customer protection requirements of P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.111(c)(2)(F). Anjuli Walker of the Commission's Financial Review Section reviewed

the application to determine whether it meets the requirements of PURA §54.154(b)(3) and P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.111(c) and (d). Staff recommendations are included as attachments to this pleading and provide more specific information concerning the applicant's satisfaction of the technical, customer protection, and financial requirements.

III. Staff Recommendation

After reviewing the applicant's application filed in this docket, and as evidenced by the attached recommendations of the Staff members referenced above, Staff has determined that the applicant has met the requirements of PURA §§54.151 - 54.159 and P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.111 for an SPCOA to provide facilities-based telecommunications services within the geographic area of the entire State of Texas.

Staff respectfully requests that an order be issued consistent with this recommendation.

Summary of Conclusions and Recommendations

Commission Staff (Staff) finds that PRIDE Network, Inc. meets the technical criteria for a Service Provider Certificate of Operating Authority (SPCOA), pursuant to the Public Utility Regulatory Act (Tex. Util. Code Ann. §§54.151 - 54.159) (PURA) and Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC) Substantive Rule 26.111. Staff recommends that PRIDE Network, Inc. be deemed technically qualified to be granted an SPCOA to provide Facilities-based and Resale telecommunications services for the entire State of Texas. Staff recommends approval of this application. If approved, the Applicant has requested that the name on the SPCOA certificate be "PRIDE Network, Inc."

Background Information on Application

On August 3, 2009, PRIDE Network, Inc. filed an application seeking an SPCOA. Order No. 1 was issued on August 6, 2009, entering a protective order, establishing a procedural schedule, and determining filing and service procedures. On August 10, 2009, PRIDE Network, Inc. filed a revised response to Question 9(c). On August 12, 2009, Staff filed its recommendation on eligibility. Order No. 2 was issued on August 19, 2009, certifying eligibility. On August 19, 2009, Staff filed a recommendation on deficiency/completeness of this application. Order No. 3 was issued on August 26, 2009, providing notification that Staff deems the application is sufficient and complete.

Description of Services

PRIDE Network, Inc. is a Texas corporation as of April 3, 2009. The Secretary of State (SoS) issued an authorization to transact business in the State of Texas to PRIDE Network, Inc. under file number 801105797 as of April 3, 2009. We checked the requested name against the certificate of operating authority (COA), service provider certificate of operating authority (SPCOA) and incumbent local exchange company (ILEC) official lists and found no similar names. We checked the Interexchange Carriers (IXCs) list and found one similar name: PRIDE America, Inc. (IXC No. IX011055). After reviewing the existing names, Staff concludes that the Applicant's requested name "PRIDE Network, Inc." is distinctive and acceptable.

PRIDE Network, Inc. does not hold a service provider certificate of operating authority (SPCOA), certificate of operating authority (COA) or a certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) for any part of the service area covered by this application in Texas. The Applicant (and its affiliates: NTS Communications, Inc. - SPCOA No. 60044 and NTS Telephone Company, LLC d/b/a NTS of Levelland - SPCOA No. 60778) have applied for and been granted local and/or long distance service authority in the following states: Colorado, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico and Oklahoma. The applicant has never had any telecommunications authority revoked.

PRIDE Network, Inc. intends to provide Facilities-based and Resale local exchange service. PRIDE Network, Inc. intends to provide Business and Residential: POTS, Optical Services, Wireless and Long Distance. PRIDE Network, Inc. does not intend to provide residential or business local, domestic and international prepaid calling services. PRIDE Network, Inc. has not established a toll-free customer service number at this time, but has committed to establishing one before it begins business. PRIDE Network, Inc. has established a principal office phone number (806) 797-0687, a fax number (806) 788-3393, and an email address (Barbara.baldwin@ntscom.com).

PRIDE Network, Inc. requested that its service area be the entire State of Texas.

Additional Information Requested for Technical Review

PRIDE Network, Inc. was requested to provide any additional technical information concerning Question No. 9(c) of this application. On August 10, 2009, PRIDE Network, Inc. filed additional information concerning Question No. 9(c) of this application.

Technical Qualifications

PRIDE Network, Inc.'s management consists of key personnel that have accumulated over 140 years of telecommunications experience. Ms. Barbara Baldwin – President – has over 27 years of telecommunications experience in management, sales, marketing, information systems, customer service and account administration. Mr. Brad Worthington, Esq. – Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer - has over 9 years of telecommunications experience in management, regulatory affairs, contracts and business negotiations. Mr. Jerry Hoover – Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer – has over 20 years of telecommunications experience in management, accounting, taxes and auditing. Mr. Cary Collins – Vice President – Network Operations - has over 30 years of telecommunications experience in management, equipment installations, maintenance and repair, operations, special projects, switching, transport, outside plant, and engineering. Mr. Gary Sams – Vice President Service Delivery – has over 27 years of telecommunications experience in management, operations, NCC, network engineering, inventory, transmission, maintenance, data network and switching centers. Mr. Milton Schober, Jr. – Vice President Data Services – has over 17 years of telecommunications experience in management, data services, fiber optic cable, web-hosting, and network

applications. Mr. Daniel Wheeler – Vice President and General Counsel – has over 9 years of telecommunications experience in management, contracts, regulatory compliance, arbitrations, general legal research, outside counsel, litigations and internal investigations.

Compliance Check

Staff checked with the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) to determine if any compliance infractions were registered against PRIDE Network, Inc. OAG was requested to respond if they had any registered compliance infractions against the Applicant. The OAG did not respond.

Staff checked with the Texas Comptroller's Office to determine if PRIDE Network, Inc. is in compliance with its statutes and rules. The Comptroller's Office website showed the following for PRIDE Network, Inc. (Taxpayer ID# 32039238848): "In Good Standing not for Dissolution or Withdrawal through July 1, 2010".

PRIDE Network, Inc. indicated through its responses to the PUC's Service Quality Questionnaire that it will meet the quality of service standards as they are applicable.

Complaint Check

After checking the database of the Customer Protection Division (CPD), Staff has determined that PRIDE Network, Inc. (and its affiliate NTS Communications, Inc. and NTS Telephone Company, LLC d/b/a NTS of Levelland) has 10 complaints for the past 24 months. PRIDE Network, Inc. filed its affiliate number of customers confidentially for the past 24 months in the State of Texas. Using the above information, the customer to complaint ratio is below 6%; therefore no further investigation is warranted.

A check of the PUC Enforcement & Investigations Database revealed that PRIDE Network, Inc. (and its affiliate NTS Communications, Inc. and NTS Telephone Company, LLC d/b/a NTS of Levelland) have no outstanding notices of violations (NOV). Since PRIDE Network, Inc. is a new applicant; it has not opened an access line account. Upon Commission approval of its requested SPCOA, PRIDE Network, Inc. shall establish an access line account and submit quarterly reports.

Conclusion

Based on the information provided by the applicant and the review and analysis of this application, Staff finds that PRIDE Network, Inc. is technically qualified to provide Facilities-based and Resale telecommunications services for the entire State of Texas. The applicant has requested that the SPCOA be issued in the name of "PRIDE Network, Inc."

Current Status

As noted above, construction was completed for the NTS Tel project in accordance with RUS deadlines in 2010. Construction was also completed by the RUS mandated deadline for each of the three PRIDE Projects. However, revised timelines, changes in executive management and several modifications of the assumptions related to the number of passings projections have had a significantly unfavorable impact on the actual results, when compared to initial revenue projections.





The NTS team believes that it can continue to improve its business and create a service valuable to both business and residential customers in the Southwest. Thousands of customers in rural West Texas and Louisiana now benefit from the services offered by NTS Tel and PRIDE through the broadband services funded by the RUS. NTS Tel and PRIDE reiterate their request for a waiver of the current default and request a meeting as soon as possible with senior executives at the RUS to further develop a plan that addresses the company's unsustainable RUS entity debt structure and that will serve to maximize the value for both the RUS and other economic stakeholders.

We have attached additional detailed historical and projected financial information in the format that we believe the RUS team requested in October and November.



PRIDE experienced some dramatic differences between the original projections and the actual numbers for passings, penetration, pricing, and profitability due to differences between the census block data and the actual available customers in the rural areas coupled with aggressive competition. Also, some additional miles were constructed to cover all available homes in the PFSA. However, fewer of these homes were occupied than originally projected.





PRIDE Network, Inc. (PRIDE Net) was granted funding by the Broadband Initiatives Program (BIP) for two applications during round one of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) stimulus session for two Fiber to the Premise (FTTP) projects in Texas. During this second round of ARRA stimulus funding PRIDE Net proposes, with the North Shore Project, to extend its network to make Advance Broadband Services available to the economically depressed and underserved residents, businesses and Critical Community Facilities (CCFs) in the rural North Shore areas of Franklinton, Hammond, Independence, Mountpelier, Natalbany, Ponchatoula, Tickfaw, and surrounding non-census communities within the State of Louisiana.

PRIDE Net is determined to provide reasonably priced quality Advanced Broadband Service to needed areas of persistent poverty and communities that have experienced the current economic downfall. In consideration of the awards granted during the first ARRA round of funding, it is evident that PRIDE Net is well suited to follow any and all procedures required by the ARRA. NTS Communications, Inc. (NTS), through its subsidiary, PRIDE Net is fully capable of constructing and operating the North Shore Project in a competent manner in compliance with all

applicable Federal, state, and local laws. NTS was formed in 1981 and achieved competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") status in 1999. NTS operates as a wholly owned subsidiary of Xfone, Inc. (NYSE Alternext: "XFN"). NTS is headquartered in Lubbock, Texas and with its staff of 300-plus employees, provides a full range of wireline voice and data services to customers in Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. Acting in a management capacity, NTS also directs the business and service delivery of its sister company, Xfone USA, Inc. (Xfone USA), which provides a full range of similar voice and data services to customers in Louisiana and Mississippi.

Since 2004, NTS has engaged in an aggressive build-out of Fiber to the Premise (FTTP) networks in Lubbock, Wolfforth, and Woodrow, Texas. To date, NTS has constructed approximately 650 route miles of fiber optic distribution plant encompassing in excess of 18,000 gross passings in these communities. Using its FTTP facilities, NTS provides full-featured Broadband voice, IPTV video, and data services to its customers. Of note, NTS Telephone Company, LLC, a subsidiary of NTS, has been the recipient of an \$11.9 million USDA Rural Utilities Service (RUS) Broadband Loan, including approximately 98 route miles of fiber cable, to bring broadband voice, video, and data services, via FTTP, to the communities of Levelland and Smyer, Texas. This project is currently completing the last phases of construction. Through the construction activities listed above, considerable knowledge and experience has been gained by the NTS staff related to all construction associated requirements mandated by the State of Texas and by Rural Utilities Service (RUS), as well as, invaluable experience with RUS accounting procedures.

The proposed funded service area (PFSA) for the BIP North Shore Project will include the US census communities of Amite, Franklinton, Hammond, Independence, Mountpelier, Natalbany, Ponchatoula, Tickfaw within the State of Louisiana. It will also include the non-census areas around and between these communities. The proposed Last Mile Service Area for this project is 100% rural and will cover an approximate area of 348 square miles and include a population of 26,632 with approximately 10,097 Households, 2,978 Businesses and 172 Critical Community Facilities. Market survey results, competitive analysis, on the ground research, and careful review of the incumbent provider's online broadband qualification tools have provided evidence that the PFSA is underserved by ARRA definition.

Some of the communities proposed to be served by the PRIDE Net currently have broadband service, however, where broadband is available it is limited and sporadic. Broadband subscription rates shown by the research described above concludes the existing service is not affordable to most of the people that reside in those communities, including those that have lost their jobs during the current financial crisis and need the advantages that Advanced Broadband Services can provide in finding a job. Most of the PFSA does not have access to broadband service at the speeds mandated by the ARRA. The North Shore Project will make Advanced Broadband Services available to those underserved areas. In the limited areas where broadband service is currently available, PRIDE Net will offer a competitive choice that will be far more affordable.

PRIDE Net's parent company, NTS, as described above, operates a large existing network that will provide a reliable support framework, back-office, and network interface infrastructure; via

a service agreement, as a result, PRIDE Net will be able to immediately provide carrier class service and reliability for this proposed service area. A service agreement with PRIDE Net's sister company, Xfone USA, will also be in place to cover co-location and local support. These existing capabilities and resources will be instrumental in PRIDE Net's ability to maintain the project schedule.

PRIDE Net's service area will be divided into two portions:

- 1. **Broadband over Fiber Optics:** Broadband service provided through a standards based Calix (or similar product) access network utilizing passive GPON distribution over FTTP fiber optic cables deployed to each subscriber's home or building. The majority of establishments will be reached through this method.
- 2. **Broadband over Wireless:** Broadband service that uses wireless broadband radio spectrum to distribute broadband to the subscriber premise. PRIDE Net will install equipment on existing primary towers to reach subscriber homes or buildings. Each subscriber will have a specialized radio at their premise to communicate with the towers. Entities beyond the economical reach of the FTTP plant, and/or entities who wish to subscribe to a lower speed more economical broadband package will be served through this method.

The proposed North Shore Project plans to put transport and access equipment into the Xfone USA's co-location Central Office building located in Hammond, Louisiana, one (1) remote access node in a Remote Office building in Amite, Louisiana, and eight (8) proposed remote access node cabinets, of which, seven (7) are co-located at existing wireless tower or elevated structure sites located in the US census communities and non-census area as listed in the chart below. The Hammond Co-Location connections will allow PRIDE Net to obtain access to the Public Internet Backbone, Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN), and to broadband video and other content provided to PRIDE Net through a service agreement with its affiliate Xfone USA. The Hammond Co-Location will allow the use of "Leased Fibers" to provide a complete fiber loop for this network.

A 10 Gigabit per second, standards based, open access, Ethernet transport service will be initially enabled for the transmission of broadband data, voice, and video service over fiber optic cable to the proposed FTTP and Wireless distribution plants. Each active PON node and tower location will be physically connected to this transport feed via fiber. The equipment will also allow for the redundant distribution of services within the new network. The existing Xfone USA facilities in Hammond, Louisiana are currently outfitted with air conditioning, power, emergency power, battery, grounding, fire suppression, security, and other ancillary equipment as necessary to provide a carrier class, five 9's, reliable, redundant service.

Minor renovations and basic office fit-up of the purchased building are projected to be necessary in order to create a small equipment room to house the proposed network access equipment and to facilitate the local sales and support activities. The building will have the necessary ducting, racking, cabling, environmental conditioning, emergency power backup, fire suppression, security, and other ancillary equipment installed to provide a carrier grade environment for the network access equipment. ORDER NO. 1 ENTERING PROTECTIVE ORDER, ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE, AND DETERMINING FILING AND SERVICE PROCEDURES

On August 3, 2009, PRIDE Network, Inc. (the Applicant) filed an application under § 54.151 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act, Tex. Util. Code Ann. (Vernon 2007 & Supp. 2008) (PURA) for approval of a Service Provider Certificate of Operating Authority (SPCOA) to provide facilities-based telecommunications services within the geographic area of the entire State of Texas. Under PURA § 54.155, the Public Utility Commission of Texas (the Commission) is required to act on the petition within 60 days after filing unless the Commission finds that good cause exists to extend the 60-day period. The 60-day period in this docket ends October 2, 2009. The docket may be considered for administrative approval on or before October 2, 2009.

This Order sets forth the procedures the parties shall follow and includes the deadlines for intervention, the Commission Staff's recommendation, and request for referral to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH). In addition, attached is the generic protective order used in Commission Certificate of Operating Authority (COA)/SPCOA proceedings. This protective order shall govern the use of all confidential materials in this case.

The Commission shall publish notice in the *Texas Register* in accordance with the attached procedural schedule. A copy of the notice is attached to this Order.

Under the procedural schedule, Commission Staff is required to file a recommendation regarding the eligibility of the Applicant to apply for an SPCOA and the deficiencies/completeness of the application. Commission Staff will also verify that the name under which the Applicant has requested that the SPCOA be issued will not duplicate a name already being used by an existing SPCOA holder or be so similar to a name currently being used

so as to create confusion. The Applicant shall be notified of any conflicts or duplications and shall submit a new name by August 24, 2009, if required. Commission Staff's recommendation on eligibility shall be filed no later than August 12, 2009. Any response from the Applicant is due by August 17, 2009. The Commission's Order on eligibility is due by August 19, 2009. Commission Staff's recommendation on deficiencies/completeness shall be filed no later than August 19, 2009. The Commission's Order on deficiencies/completeness is due by August 26, 2009.

This case has been assigned Docket No. 37331 by the Commission. All pleadings filed in this case shall use this docket number.

I. Filing and Service Procedures

A. Filing

Parties shall file seven (7) copies of all pleadings. Pleadings and other filings shall be deemed filed when the proper number of legible copies are presented to the Commission's Filing Clerk for filing.

The procedures regarding filing specified in Subchapter E of the Commission's procedural rules apply in this proceeding, unless otherwise specified. Parties are expected to know those procedures and comply with them fully.

B. Service

A copy of any document filed with the Commission must also be served on all parties as provided by P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.74(a). Documents hand-delivered to the Commission must be served on all parties, filed with the Commission filing clerk, and file-stamped prior to delivery.

To expedite this proceeding, the parties are strongly urged to serve pleadings, briefs, and other documents in this docket by hand-delivery, FAX, overnight courier, or electronic means, as opposed to service by mail.

All mail sent to the parties by the Commission will be sent by first class mail, unless the party requests express mailing and provides an express mail account number. Parties seeking to arrange express mailing should contact Ms. Helen Mastrangelo at (512) 936-7249.

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Pursuant to P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.101, all parties shall provide their current telephone and facsimile number, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such numbers. Each party is responsible for providing the Commission and all parties with current address, telephone, and facsimile information if such information changes. Only one address per party will be included on the service list maintained by the Commission. Corrections to the service list should be directed to Ms. Mastrangelo. The parties may agree to serve more than one representative per party. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of other parties, if any.

C. Filing Deadline Procedures

Filings at the Commission shall occur by 3:00 p.m. on the date in question unless otherwise specified. P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.71(i).

Parties are encouraged to engage in negotiations. The conduct of negotiations, however, does not relieve the parties of their obligation to meet filing deadlines. Failure to meet such deadlines may subject a party to sanctions specified in P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.161.

D. Assumptions Regarding Time of Receipt

To the extent it is necessary to make an assumption regarding the time of receipt of a document, the following guidelines shall apply. Service on a party by agent or by courier receipted delivery shall be complete upon delivery to the agent or courier. Service on a party by facsimile transmission shall be complete upon actual receipt by the recipient's telecopier or facsimile transfer machine. Under P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.74(b), service on a party by mail shall be complete upon deposit of the document, enclosed in a wrapper properly addressed, stamped and sealed, in a post office or official depository of the United States Postal Service.

Under P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.74(c), a return receipt or affidavit of any person having personal knowledge of the facts shall be prima facie evidence of the facts shown thereon relating to service.

1. Hand Delivery

If a document has been served in person or by agent, the Commission will assume that the document was received on the date of filing.

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2. Courier Receipted Delivery

If a document was served by courier receipted delivery, the Commission will assume that the document was received no later than the day after filing.

3. Facsimile Transmission

If a document is served by facsimile transmission before 3:00 p.m., on a work day, the Commission will assume that the document was received on that day; otherwise, the Commission will assume that the document was received on the next work day.

4. Regular Mail, Certified Mail, Or Registered Mail

If a document has been sent by regular mail, certified mail, or registered mail, the Commission will assume that it was received no later than three days after filing.

E. Motions for Continuance or Cancellation of a Proceeding or Extension of a Deadline

Motions for continuance shall be governed by the requirements of P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.79. If a continuance or extension of a deadline is sought, the motion shall propose a new date or dates and shall indicate whether the parties contacted agree on the new date or dates. If the continuance requires an extension of the 60-day deadline in this docket, the requesting party shall indicate this in its motion for continuance and state good-cause why the deadline should be extended. More than two requests for continuance or extension are discouraged. The requesting party shall make all reasonable efforts to provide all required information to satisfy the Commission rules for technical and financial qualification. Failure to provide information after a good cause exception has been granted may subject the application to abatement or dismissal.

The Commission will not contact parties to ascertain their positions or to negotiate dates. In the absence of a ruling by the Commission, if a contested motion for continuance, cancellation, or extension is not granted, the existing schedule remains in place.

F. Responses to Motions and Other Pleadings

Unless otherwise specified, responses to any motion or other pleading shall be filed within three working days from the filing of the pleading to which the response is made. Failure

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to file a timely response will be considered acquiescence to the relief requested. Rulings will be based on the written pleadings unless the Commission determines that oral argument is necessary.

П. **Deadline for Intervention**

Motions to intervene shall be filed by August 26, 2009. Motions to intervene shall demonstrate the movant's standing to intervene under P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.103. Motions to intervene shall be served on all parties, and shall include a certificate of service. Movants for intervention shall immediately enjoy all the rights and bear all the obligations of party status unless and until their motions to intervene are denied.

III. Discovery

Exclusive Formal Discovery Method A.

Due to the extreme time constraints imposed on the parties and the Commission by the statutory deadline, parties may obtain formal discovery only through depositions by oral examination. Dispositions shall be taken at a time and place agreed upon by the parties or ordered by the Commission. The parties are strongly advised to agree as to the date and time for depositions.

Nothing in this order prohibits the parties from engaging in informal requests for information (RFIs), although the Commission will not resolve any disputes arising from the informal discovery process.

В. In Camera Review

To the extent an in camera inspection is necessary, the in camera inspection will be governed by P.U.C. Proc. R. 22.144(g), although the Commission may establish deadlines for pleadings which differ from those set by the procedural rule. Documents submitted for in camera review SHALL NOT BE FILED WITH THE COMMISSION FILING CLERK but should be hand-delivered to the Commission. If they are filed with the Commission filing clerk, even inadvertently, the documents may not be physically removed from the Commission. Further, any claim to privilege or exemption could be found to have been waived by such filing

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with the Commission filing clerk. At the time the documents are submitted for *in camera* review, the objecting party shall file sworn affidavits setting out the facts necessary to support the explanation and the privilege or exemption that is claimed. The affidavits will be public documents and as such shall be filed with the Commission filing clerk and served upon the propounding party.

Should the Commission determine, following an *in camera* review that a document is not privileged or exempt, the Commission will stay the order for three full working days to allow the party claiming the privilege or exemption to appeal that order.

IV. Procedural Schedule

The parties shall adhere to the following procedural schedule in this docket. Unless this case becomes contested, it is to be handled administratively by the Commission.

Intervention Deadline August 26, 2009

Commission Staff's Final Recommendation September 2, 2009

Deadline for Request for Referral to SOAH September 2, 2009

If it appears that this application will be contested and a hearing necessary, the parties will be required to submit a list of contested issues setting forth the reasons for their disputing the application (see Section V.).

V. Hearing on the Merits

In the event a party requests a hearing on the merits, the contesting party shall file a request for a referral to SOAH along with a list of those issues it contests and the grounds for contesting. The party shall clearly and succinctly identify any contested issue; any issues so identified constitute the only issues which can be addressed in the hearing.

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VI. Ex Parte Communications

Ex parte communications with the Commission are prohibited. Parties should undertake to communicate with the Commission only through written documents filed with the Commission and served on all parties.

PROTECTIVE ORDER

This Protective Order shall govern the use of all information deemed confidential (Protected Materials) or highly confidential (Highly Sensitive Protected Materials), including information whose confidentiality is currently under dispute, by a party providing information to the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) or to any other party to this proceeding.

It is ORDERED that:

- Designation of Protected Materials. Upon producing or filing a document, including, 1. but not limited to, records on a computer disk or other similar electronic storage medium in this proceeding, the producing party may designate that document, or any portion of it, as confidential pursuant to this Protective Order by typing or stamping on its face "PROTECTED PURSUANT TO PROTECTIVE ORDER ISSUED IN DOCKET NO. 37331" (or words to this effect) and consecutively Bates Stamping each page. Protected Materials and Highly Sensitive Protected Materials include the documents so designated, as well as the substance of the information contained in the documents and any description, report, summary, or statement about the substance of the information contained in the documents.
- Materials Excluded from Protected Materials Designation. Protected Materials shall 2. not include any information or document contained in the public files of the Commission or any other federal or state agency, court, or local governmental authority subject to the Public Information Act.1 Protected Materials also shall not include documents or information which at the time of, or prior to disclosure in, a proceeding is or was public

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knowledge, or which becomes public knowledge other than through disclosure in violation of this Protective Order.

- 3. **Reviewing Party**. For the purposes of this Protective Order, a "Reviewing Party" is any party to this docket.
- 4. Procedures for Designation of Protected Materials. On or before the date the Protected Materials or Highly Sensitive Protected Materials are provided to the Commission, the producing party shall file with the Commission and deliver to each party to the proceeding a written statement, which may be in the form of an objection, indicating: (a) any exemptions to the Public Information Act claimed to apply to the alleged Protected Materials; (b) the reasons supporting the producing party's claim that the responsive information is exempt from public disclosure under the Public Information Act and subject to treatment as protected materials; and (c) that counsel for the producing party has reviewed the information sufficiently to state in good faith that the information is exempt from public disclosure under the Public Information Act and merits the Protected Materials designation.
- Persons Permitted Access to Protected Materials. Except as otherwise provided in this Protective Order, a Reviewing Party may access Protected Materials only through its "Reviewing Representatives" who have signed the Protective Order Certification Form (see Attachment A). Reviewing Representatives of a Reviewing Party include its counsel of record in this proceeding and associated attorneys, paralegals, economists, statisticians, accountants, consultants, or other persons employed or retained by the Reviewing Party and directly engaged in this proceeding. At the request of the PUC Commissioners, copies of Protected Materials may be produced by Commission Staff. The Commissioners and their staff shall be informed of the existence and coverage of this Protective Order and shall observe the restrictions of the Protective Order.
- 6. <u>Highly Sensitive Protected Material Described</u>. The term "Highly Sensitive Protected Materials" is a subset of Protected Materials and refers to documents or information that a producing party claims is of such a highly sensitive nature that making copies of such documents or information or providing access to such documents to employees of the

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Reviewing Party (except as specified herein) would expose a producing party to unreasonable risk of harm. Highly Sensitive Protected Materials include but are not limited to: (a) contractual information pertaining to contracts that specify that their terms are confidential or that are confidential pursuant to an order entered in litigation to which the producing party is a party; (b) wholesale transactions information and/or marketsensitive marketing plans; and (c) business operations or financial information that is commercially sensitive. Documents or information so classified by a producing party shall bear the designation "HIGHLY SENSITIVE PROTECTED MATERIALS PROVIDED PURSUANT TO PROTECTIVE ORDER ISSUED IN DOCKET NO. 37331" (or words to this effect) and shall be consecutively Bates Stamped. The provisions of this Protective Order pertaining to Protected Materials also apply to Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, except where this Protective Order provides for additional protections for Highly Sensitive Protected Materials. In particular, the procedures herein for challenging the producing party's designation of information as Protected Materials also apply to information that a producing party designates as Highly Sensitive Protected Materials.

7. Restrictions on Copying and Inspection of Highly Sensitive Protected Material.

Except as expressly provided herein, only one copy may be made of any Highly Sensitive Protected Materials except that additional copies may be made to have sufficient copies for introduction of the material into the evidentiary record if the material is to be offered for admission into the record. The Reviewing Party shall maintain a record of all copies made of Highly Sensitive Protected Material and shall send a duplicate of the record to the producing party when the copy or copies are made. The record shall specify the location and the person possessing the copy. Highly Sensitive Protected Material shall be made available for inspection only at the location or locations provided by the producing party, except as specified by Paragraph 9. Limited notes may be made of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, and such notes shall themselves be treated as Highly Sensitive Protected Materials unless such notes are limited to a description of the document and a general characterization of its subject matter in a manner that does not state any substantive information contained in the document.

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- 8. Restricting Persons Who May Have Access to Highly Sensitive Protected Material. With the exception of Commission Staff, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG), and the Office of Public Utility Counsel (OPC), and except as provided herein, the Reviewing Representatives for the purpose of access to Highly Sensitive Protected Materials may be persons who are (a) outside counsel for the Reviewing Party, (b) outside consultants for the Reviewing Party working under the direction of Reviewing Party's counsel or, (c) employees of the Reviewing Party working with and under the direction of Reviewing Party's counsel who have been authorized by the presiding officer to review Highly Sensitive Protected Materials. The Reviewing Party shall limit the number of Reviewing Representatives that review Highly Sensitive Protected Materials to the minimum number of persons necessary. The Reviewing Party is under a good faith obligation to limit access to each portion of any Highly Sensitive Protected Materials to two Reviewing Representatives whenever possible. Reviewing Representatives for Commission Staff, OAG, and OPC, for the purpose of access to Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, shall consist of their respective counsel of record in this proceeding and associated attorneys, paralegals, economists, statisticians, accountants, consultants, or other persons employed or retained by them and directly engaged in these proceedings.
- 9. Copies Provided of Highly Sensitive Protected Material. A producing party shall provide one copy of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials specifically requested by the Reviewing Party to the person designated by the Reviewing Party who must be a person authorized to review Highly Sensitive Protected Material under Paragraph 8. Representatives of the Reviewing Party who are authorized to view Highly Sensitive Protected Material may review the copy of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials at the office of the Reviewing Party's representative designated to receive the information. Any Highly Sensitive Protected Materials provided to a Reviewing Party may not be copied except as provided in Paragraph 7. The restrictions contained herein do not apply to Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG when the OAG is a representing a party to the proceeding.
- 10. Procedures in Paragraphs 10-14 Apply to Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG

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and Control in the Event of Conflict. The procedures in Paragraphs 10 through 14 apply to responses to requests for documents or information that the producing party designates as Highly Sensitive Protected Materials and provides to Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG in recognition of their purely public functions. To the extent the requirements of Paragraphs 10 through 14 conflict with any requirements contained in other paragraphs of this Protective Order, the requirements of these Paragraphs shall control.

- OPC and the OAG. When, in response to a request for information by a Reviewing Party, the producing party makes available for review documents or information claimed to be Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, the producing party shall also deliver one copy of the Highly Sensitive Protected Materials to the Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG (if the OAG is representing a party) in Austin, Texas. Provided however, that in the event such Highly Sensitive Protected Materials are voluminous, the materials will be made available for review by Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG (if the OAG is representing a party) at the designated office in Austin, Texas. The Commission Staff, OPC and the OAG (if the OAG is representing a party) may request such copies as are necessary of such voluminous material under the copying procedures specified herein.
- <u>and Outside Consultants</u>. The Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG (if the OAG is representing a party) may deliver the copy of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials received by them to the appropriate members of their staff for review, provided such staff members first sign the certification specified by Paragraph 15. After obtaining the agreement of the producing party, Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG (if the OAG is representing a party) may deliver the copy of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials received by it to the agreed, appropriate members of their outside consultants for review, provided such outside consultants first sign the certification in Attachment A.
- 13. Restriction on Copying by Commission Staff, OPC and the OAG. Except as allowed by Paragraph 7, Commission Staff, OPC and the OAG may not make additional copies of

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the Highly Sensitive Protected Materials furnished to them unless the producing party agrees in writing otherwise, or, upon a showing of good cause, the presiding officer directs otherwise. Commission Staff, OPC, and the OAG may make limited notes of Highly Sensitive Protected Materials furnished to them, and all such handwritten notes will be treated as Highly Sensitive Protected Materials as are the materials from which the notes are taken.

- Public Information Requests. In the event of a request for any of the Highly Sensitive Protected Materials under the Public Information Act, an authorized representative of the Commission, OPC, or the OAG may furnish a copy of the requested Highly Sensitive Protected Materials to the Open Records Division at the OAG together with a copy of this Protective Order after notifying the producing party that such documents are being furnished to the OAG. Such notification may be provided simultaneously with the delivery of the Highly Sensitive Protected Materials to the OAG.
- 15. <u>Required Certification</u>. Each person who inspects the Protected Materials shall, before such inspection, agree in writing to the following certification found in Attachment A to this Protective Order:

I certify my understanding that the Protected Materials are provided to me pursuant to the terms and restrictions of the Protective Order in this docket, and that I have been given a copy of it and have read the Protective Order and agree to be bound by it. I understand that the contents of the Protected Materials, any notes, memoranda, or any other form of information regarding or derived from the Protected Materials shall not be disclosed to anyone other than in accordance with the Protective Order and unless I am an employee of the Commission or OPC shall be used only for the purpose of the proceeding in Docket No. 37331. I acknowledge that the obligations imposed by this certification are pursuant to such Protective Order. Provided, however, if the information contained in the Protected Materials is obtained from independent public sources, the understanding stated herein shall not apply.

In addition, Reviewing Representatives who are permitted access to Highly Sensitive Protected Material under the terms of this Protective Order shall, before inspection of such material, agree in writing to the following certification found in Attachment A to Docket No. 37331

I certify that I am eligible to have access to Highly Sensitive Protected Material under the terms of the Protective Order in this docket.

The Reviewing Party shall provide a copy of each signed certification to Counsel for the producing party and serve a copy upon all parties of record.

- **16.** Disclosures between Reviewing Representatives and Continuation of Disclosure Restrictions after a Person is no Longer Engaged in the Proceeding. Any Reviewing Representative may disclose Protected Materials, other than Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, to any other person who is a Reviewing Representative provided that, if the person to whom disclosure is to be made has not executed and provided for delivery of a signed certification to the party asserting confidentiality, that certification shall be executed prior to any disclosure. A Reviewing Representative may disclose Highly Sensitive Protected Material to other Reviewing Representatives who are permitted access to such material and have executed the additional certification required for persons who receive access to Highly Sensitive Protected Material. In the event that any Reviewing Representative to whom Protected Materials are disclosed ceases to be engaged in these proceedings, access to Protected Materials by that person shall be terminated and all notes, memoranda, or other information derived from the protected material shall either be destroyed or given to another Reviewing Representative of that party who is authorized pursuant to this Protective Order to receive the protected materials. Any person who has agreed to the foregoing certification shall continue to be bound by the provisions of this Protective Order so long as it is in effect, even if no longer engaged in these proceedings.
- Producing Party to Provide One Copy of Certain Protected Material and Procedures for Making Additional Copies of Such Materials. Except for Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, which shall be provided to the Reviewing Parties pursuant to Paragraphs 9, and voluminous Protected Materials, the producing party shall provide a Reviewing Party one copy of the Protected Materials upon receipt of the signed certification described in Paragraph 15. Except for Highly Sensitive Protected Materials,

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- a Reviewing Party may make further copies of Protected Materials for use in this proceeding pursuant to this Protective Order, but a record shall be maintained as to the documents reproduced and the number of copies made, and upon request the Reviewing Party shall provide the party asserting confidentiality with a copy of that record.
- 18. Procedures Regarding Voluminous Protected Materials. P.U.C. PROC. R. 22.144(h) will govern production of voluminous Protected Materials. Voluminous Protected Materials will be made available in the producing party's voluminous room, in Austin, Texas, or at a mutually agreed upon location, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (except on state or Federal holidays), and at other mutually convenient times upon reasonable request.
- 19. Reviewing Period Defined. The Protected Materials may be reviewed only during the Reviewing Period, which shall commence upon entry of this Protective Order and continue until the expiration of the Commission's plenary jurisdiction. The Reviewing Period shall reopen if the Commission regains jurisdiction due to a remand as provided by law. Protected materials that are admitted into the evidentiary record or accompanying the evidentiary record as offers of proof may be reviewed throughout the pendency of this proceeding and any appeals.
- 20. Procedures for Making Copies of Voluminous Protected Materials. Other than Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, Reviewing Parties may take notes regarding the information contained in voluminous Protected Materials made available for inspection or they may make photographic, mechanical or electronic copies of the Protected Materials, subject to the conditions in this Protective Order; provided, however, that before photographic, mechanical or electronic copies may be made, the Reviewing Party seeking photographic, mechanical or electronic copies must provide written confirmation of the receipt of copies listed on Attachment B of this Protective Order identifying each piece of Protected Materials or portions thereof the Reviewing Party will need.
- 21. <u>Protected Materials to be Used Solely for the Purposes of These Proceedings</u>. All Protected Materials shall be made available to the Reviewing Parties and their Reviewing Representatives solely for the purposes of these proceedings. Access to the Protected

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Materials may not be used in the furtherance of any other purpose, including, without limitation: (a) any other pending or potential proceeding involving any claim, complaint, or other grievance of whatever nature, except appellate review proceedings that may arise from or be subject to these proceedings; or (b) any business or competitive endeavor of whatever nature. Because of their statutory regulatory obligations, these restrictions do not apply to Commission Staff or OPC.

- Procedures for Confidential Treatment of Protected Materials and Information Derived from Those Materials. Protected Materials, as well as a Reviewing Party's notes, memoranda, or other information regarding or derived from the Protected Materials are to be treated confidentially by the Reviewing Party and shall not be disclosed or used by the Reviewing Party except as permitted and provided in this Protective Order. Information derived from or describing the Protected Materials shall be maintained in a secure place and shall not be placed in the public or general files of the Reviewing Party except in accordance with the provisions of this Protective Order. A Reviewing Party must take all reasonable precautions to insure that the Protected Materials including notes and analyses made from Protected Materials that disclose Protected Materials are not viewed or taken by any person other than a Reviewing Representative of a Reviewing Party.
- 23. Procedures for Submission of Protected Materials. If a Reviewing Party tenders for filing any Protected Materials, including Highly Sensitive Protected Materials, or any written testimony, exhibit, brief, motion or other type of pleading or other submission at the Commission or before any other judicial body that quotes from Protected Materials or discloses the content of Protected Materials, the confidential portion of such submission shall be filed and served in sealed envelopes or other appropriate containers endorsed to the effect that they contain Protected Material or Highly Sensitive Protected Material and are sealed pursuant to this Protective Order. If filed at the Commission, such documents shall be marked "PROTECTED MATERIAL" and shall be filed under seal with the presiding officer and served under seal to the counsel of record for the Reviewing Parties. The presiding officer may subsequently, on his/her own motion or on motion of a party,

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ruling respecting whether or not the inclusion, incorporation or reference to Protected Materials is such that such submission should remain under seal. If filing before a judicial body, the filing party: (a) shall notify the party which provided the information within sufficient time so that the producing party may seek a temporary sealing order; and (b) shall otherwise follow the procedures in Rule 76a, Texas Rules of Civil Procedure.

- 24. Maintenance of Protected Status of Materials during Pendency of Appeal of Order Holding Materials are not Protected Materials. In the event that the presiding officer at any time in the course of this proceeding finds that all or part of the Protected Materials are not confidential or proprietary, by finding, for example, that such materials have entered the public domain or materials claimed to be Highly Sensitive Protected Materials are only Protected Materials, those materials shall nevertheless be subject to the protection afforded by this Protective Order for three (3) full working days, unless otherwise ordered, from the date the party asserting confidentiality receives notice of the presiding officer's order. Such notification will be by written communication. This provision establishes a deadline for appeal of a presiding officer's order to the Commission. In the event an appeal to the Commissioners is filed within those three (3) working days from notice, the Protected Materials shall be afforded the confidential treatment and status provided in this Protective Order during the pendency of such appeal. Neither the party asserting confidentiality nor any Reviewing Party waives its right to seek additional administrative or judicial remedies after the Commission's denial of any appeal.
- 25. Notice of Intent to Use Protected Materials or Change Materials Designation.

 Parties intending to use Protected Materials shall notify the other parties prior to offering them into evidence or otherwise disclosing such information into the record of the proceeding. During the pendency of Docket No. 37331 at the Commission, in the event that a Reviewing Party wishes to disclose Protected Materials to any person to whom disclosure is not authorized by this Protective Order, or wishes to have changed the designation of certain information or material as Protected Materials by alleging, for

example, that such information or material has entered the public domain, such Reviewing Party shall first file and serve on all parties written notice of such proposed disclosure or request for change in designation, identifying with particularity each of such Protected Materials. A Reviewing Party shall at any time be able to file a written motion to challenge the designation of information as Protected Materials.

- 26. <u>Procedures to Contest Disclosure or Change in Designation</u>. In the event that the party asserting confidentiality wishes to contest a proposed disclosure or request for change in designation, the party asserting confidentiality shall file with the appropriate presiding officer its objection to a proposal, with supporting affidavits, if any, within five (5) working days after receiving such notice of proposed disclosure or change in designation. Failure of the party asserting confidentiality to file such an objection within this period shall be deemed a waiver of objection to the proposed disclosure or request for change in designation. Within five (5) working days after the party asserting confidentiality files its objection and supporting materials, the party challenging confidentiality may respond. Any such response shall include a statement by counsel for the party challenging such confidentiality that he or she has reviewed all portions of the materials in dispute and, without disclosing the Protected Materials, a statement as to why the Protected Materials should not be held to be confidential under current legal standards, or that the party asserting confidentiality for some reason did not allow such counsel to review such materials. If either party wishes to submit the material in question for in camera inspection, it shall do so no later than five (5) working days after the party challenging confidentiality has made its written filing.
- 27. Procedures for Presiding Officer Determination Regarding Proposed Disclosure or Change in Designation. If the party asserting confidentiality files an objection, the appropriate presiding officer will determine whether the proposed disclosure or change in designation is appropriate. Upon the request of either the producing or Reviewing Party or upon the presiding officer's own initiative, the presiding officer may conduct a prehearing conference. The burden is on the party asserting confidentiality to show that such proposed disclosure or change in designation should not be made. If the presiding

officer determines that such proposed disclosure or change in designation should be made, disclosure shall not take place earlier than three (3) full working days after such determination unless otherwise ordered. No party waives any right to seek additional administrative or judicial remedies concerning such presiding officer's ruling.

28. Maintenance of Protected Status during Periods Specified for Challenging Various Orders. Any party electing to challenge, in the courts of this state, a Commission or presiding officer determination allowing disclosure or a change in designation shall have a period of ten (10) days from: (a) the date of an unfavorable Commission order; or (b) if the Commission does not rule on an appeal of an interim order, the date an appeal of an interim order to the Commission is overruled by operation of law, to obtain a favorable ruling in state district court. Any party challenging a state district court determination allowing disclosure or a change in designation shall have an additional period of ten (10) days from the date of the order to obtain a favorable ruling from a state appeals court. Finally, any party challenging a determination of a state appeals court allowing disclosure or a change in designation shall have an additional period of ten (10) days from the date of the order to obtain a favorable ruling from the state supreme court, or other appellate court. All Protected Materials shall be afforded the confidential treatment and status provided for in this Protective Order during the periods for challenging the various orders referenced in this paragraph. For purposes of this paragraph, a favorable ruling of a state district court, state appeals court, Supreme Court or other appellate court includes any

29. Other Grounds for Objection to Use of Protected Materials Remain Applicable.

Nothing in this Protective Order shall be construed as precluding any party from objecting to the use of Protected Materials on grounds other than confidentiality, including the lack of required relevance. Nothing in this Protective Order constitutes a waiver of the right to argue for more disclosure, provided, however, that unless the Commission or a court orders such additional disclosure, all parties will abide by the restrictions imposed by the Protective Order.

30. Protection of Materials from Unauthorized Disclosure. All notices, applications,

responses or other correspondence shall be made in a manner which protects Protected Materials from unauthorized disclosure.

- <u>31.</u> Return of Copies of Protected Materials and Destruction of Information Derived from Protected Materials. Following the conclusion of these proceedings, each Reviewing Party must, no later than thirty (30) days following receipt of the notice described below, return to the party asserting confidentiality all copies of the Protected Materials provided by that party pursuant to this Protective Order and all copies reproduced by a Reviewing Party, and counsel for each Reviewing Party must provide to the party asserting confidentiality a letter by counsel that, to the best of his or her knowledge, information, and belief, all copies of notes, memoranda, and other documents regarding or derived from the Protected Materials (including copies of Protected Materials) that have not been so returned, if any, have been destroyed, other than notes, memoranda, or other documents which contain information in a form which, if made public, would not cause disclosure of the substance of Protected Materials. As used in this Protective Order, "conclusion of these proceedings" refers to the exhaustion of available appeals, or the running of the time for the making of such appeals, as provided by applicable law. If, following any appeal, the Commission conducts a remand proceeding, then the "conclusion of these proceedings" is extended by the remand to the exhaustion of available appeals of the remand, or the running of the time for making such appeals of the remand, as provided by applicable law. Promptly following the conclusion of these proceedings, counsel for the party asserting confidentiality will send a written notice to all other parties, reminding them of their obligations under this Paragraph. Nothing in this Paragraph shall prohibit counsel for each Reviewing Party from retaining two (2) copies of any filed testimony, brief, application for rehearing, hearing exhibit or other pleading which refers to Protected Materials provided that any such Protected Materials retained by counsel shall remain subject to the provisions of this Protective Order.
- 32. Applicability of Other Law. This Protective Order is subject to the requirements of the Public Information Act, the Open Meetings Act,² the Texas Securities Act³ and any other

applicable law, provided that parties subject to those acts will notify the party asserting confidentiality, if possible under those acts, prior to disclosure pursuant to those acts. Such notice shall not be required where the Protected Materials are sought by governmental officials authorized to conduct a criminal or civil investigation that relates to or involves the Protected Materials, and those governmental officials aver in writing that such notice could compromise the investigation and that the governmental entity involved will maintain the confidentiality of the Protected Materials.

- 33. Procedures for Release of Information under Order. If required by order of a governmental or judicial body, the Reviewing Party may release to such body the confidential information required by such order; provided, however, that: (a) the Reviewing Party shall notify the producing party of the order requiring the release of such information within five (5) calendar days of the date the Reviewing Party has notice of the order; (b) the Reviewing Party shall notify the producing party at least five (5) calendar days in advance of the release of the information to allow the producing party to contest any release of the confidential information; and (c) the Reviewing Party shall use its best efforts to prevent such materials from being disclosed to the public. The terms of this Protective Order do not preclude the Reviewing Party from complying with any valid and enforceable order of a state or federal court with competent jurisdiction specifically requiring disclosure of Protected Materials earlier than contemplated herein. The notice specified in this section shall not be required where the Protected Materials are sought by governmental officials authorized to conduct a criminal or civil investigation that relates to or involves the Protected Materials, and those governmental officials aver in writing that such notice could compromise the investigation and that the governmental entity involved will maintain the confidentiality of the Protected Materials.
- 34. <u>Best Efforts Defined</u>. The term "best efforts" as used in the preceding paragraph requires that the Reviewing Party attempt to ensure that disclosure is not made unless such disclosure is pursuant to a final order of a Texas governmental or Texas judicial

Description of Existing Services

The proposed funded service area in the North Shore Project has portions that have access to high speed Internet. The existing services are from cable, phone, and wireless companies, with speeds ranging from 56 kbps to a limited number of areas claiming to offer speeds up to 20 Mbps. The pricing for the current services offered, ranges anywhere from \$19.95 at the lowest speed to \$79.99 per month for mid-level speeds, for residential customers.

Justification of Pricing

PRIDE Network, Inc. intends to price its services in a manner similar to that of its parent, NTS Communications, Inc. Typically, this pricing strategy results in retail rates to consumers which are 10-15 percent below those of the incumbent provider operating in urban markets. By way of example, NTS's current base pricing package for "triple play" (voice, video, and data) services in Lubbock, TX (an urban area) is \$79.00 per month. This contrasts with the incumbent telephone company's highly touted base triple play package which offers (1) fewer channels, and (2) dramatically lower broadband speeds, for \$90.00 per month. This equates to a 12% discount as compared to comparable urban incumbent services for all product types offered on the proposed network. The pricing example is magnified when considering that PRIDE Net will, due to the underserved nature of the proposed markets in the network footprint, be offering urban pricing in rural markets. These markets have had limited, if any real choice for quality broadband service in the past, and the cost of providing service in rural areas is generally much higher than that in urban areas due to low subscriber densities. Thus, PRIDE Net is confident that its pricing methodology will prove affordable to the potential customers it seeks to serve.



NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice addresses the application of PRIDE Network, Inc. (Applicant) filed on August 3, 2009, for a service provider certificate of operating authority (SPCOA) to provide facilities-based and resale telecommunications services within the geographic area of the entire State of Texas. The docket was processed in accordance with applicable statutes and Commission rules. The Commission provided notice of the application to interested parties. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice. No protests, motions to intervene, or requests for hearing were filed. Applicant and the Commission Staff (Staff) are the only parties to the proceeding. Staff recommends approval of the application, as amended. The application, as amended, is approved.

Statutory Findings

- 1. Applicant is a Texas corporation formed on April 3, 2009, with authority to transact business in the State of Texas.
- 2. Applicant's parent company is NTS Communications, Inc.

- 3. Pursuant to PURA¹ § 54.153, Applicant has less than six percent of the total intrastate switched access minutes of use as measured by the most recent 12-month period.
- 4. The name requested by Applicant for this SPCOA does not duplicate and is not similar to a name already being used by an existing SPCOA holder.
- Applicant's owner, NTS Communications, Inc. has authority to provide long distance telecommunications services in Colorado, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, New Mexico, and Oklahoma.
- 6. Neither Applicant nor Applicant's owners or affiliates has ever had a permit, license, or certificate denied or revoked by another state.
- 7. Applicant's owner, NTS Communications, Inc., and affiliate, NTS Telephone Company, LLC, d/b/a NTS of Levelland have provided local service in Texas.
- 8. The application complies with PURA§ 54.154(b).
- 9. Pursuant to PURA §§ 54.154(b) and 54.155(b), Applicant is entitled to approval of this application. Applicant has demonstrated the required financial and technical qualifications to provide the proposed services and the ability to provide the necessary quality of service to its customers.
- 10. Applicant is not precluded by PURA §§ 54.201 or 54.152 from providing service under an SPCOA.

Complaint History

- 11. The Office of the Texas Attorney General reported no complaints registered against the Applicant.
- 12. The Commission's Customer Protection Division complaint database revealed no complaints registered against the Applicant.
- 13. The Commission's Enforcement & Investigations database revealed no outstanding notices of violation against the Applicant.
- 14. In Applicant's responses to the Commission's Service Quality Questionnaire,
 Applicant committed to continue to meet the quality of service standards.

Ordering Paragraphs

- 1. The application, as amended, of PRIDE Network, Inc. for a facilities-based and resale telecommunications SPCOA is approved. PRIDE Network, Inc. is granted SPCOA No. 60844 for the geographic area of the entire State of Texas.
- 2. Applicant shall comply with pertinent provisions of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, including the procedural requirements of FTA § 251(f)(1)(B), when seeking interconnection, services, or network elements from a rural telephone company.
- 3. Applicant shall establish an access line account and submit quarterly reports in compliance with P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.467.

An SPCOA certificate holder that has not provided service for a period of 12 consecutive months must provide a sworn affidavit to the Commission on an annual basis attesting that they continue to possess the technical and financial resources necessary to provide the level of service proposed in the initial application. An SPCOA certificate holder that has not provided service within 48 months of being granted the certificate by the Commission, may have its certificate suspended or revoked, as defined by P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.114, after due process, or undergo certification re-qualification. Applicant shall comply with the above requirements.
- 6. Applicant shall file any future changes in address, contact representative, and/or telephone numbers in an annual report with the Commission by June 30th of each year Annual Information Reporting Requirements for a Service Provider Certificate of Operating Authority and/or a Certificate of Operating Authority, Project No. 27357. If the SPCOA holder has any change during the year in the information requested in Section One of the annual report form, then the SPCOA holder shall file an updated form correcting the information in Section One within 30 days of the change.
- 7. Applicant shall provide a copy of its application and/or the Commission's Notice of Approval, in accordance with the individual entity's requirements, to all affected Commission on State Emergency Communications (9-1-1) entities prior to providing service to those entities.
- 8. Applicant's provision of local telephone service to end-users, whether by its own facilities, flat-rate resale, or usage sensitive loop, must also include "9-1-1" emergency telephone service at a level required by the applicable

regional plan followed by local telephone service providers under Chapters 771 and 772 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ANN. §§ 771.001 et seq. (Vernon 2003) (the Code) or other applicable law, and any applicable rules and regulations implementing those chapters. Applicant shall diligently work with the Commission on State Emergency Communications, local "9-1-1" entities, and any other agencies or entities authorized by Chapters 771 and 772 of the Code to ensure that all "9-1-1" emergency services, whether provided through the certificate holder's own facilities, flat-rate resale, or usage sensitive loop, are provided in a manner consistent with the applicable regional plan followed by local telephone service providers under Chapters 771 or 772 of the Code or other applicable law and any applicable rules and regulations implementing those chapters. The Applicant shall diligently work with the "9-1-1" entities to pursue, in good faith, the mutually agreed goal that the local "9-1-1" entities and emergency service providers experience no increase in their current level of rates and, to the extent technically feasible, no degradation in services as a result of the certification granted herein and the involvement of the certificate holder in the provision of "9-1-1" emergency service.

- 9. Applicant shall notify all affected 9-1-1 administrative entities at least 30 days prior to activating or using a new NXX in a rate center or upon the commencement of providing local telephone service in any rate center in compliance with P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.433(d)(3).
- 10. Applicant shall execute a separate service agreement with each 9-1-1 entity and remit the required 9-1-1 emergency service fee to the 9-1-1 entity pursuant to such agreement in compliance with P.U.C. SUBST R. 26.435(e)(4).
- 11. Applicant has committed to and is bound by the quality of service requirements set forth in the Quality of Service Questionnaire. The underlying incumbent local exchange companies (ILECs) continue to be

bound by the quality of service requirements contained in P.U.C. SUBST. R. 26.54. Approval of the SPCOA application does not expand the scope of the underlying ILEC's obligation to its own customers.

12. All other motions, requests for entry of specific findings of fact and conclusions of law, and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted herein, are hereby denied.


