## USDA Rural Development Accepting Grant Applications for 2021 REAP Energy Audit & Renewable Energy Development Assistance

Applications Due February 1, 2021

*MONTPELIER, VT*, December 8, 2020 – USDA Rural Development is now accepting applications for the <u>Rural Energy for America Program Energy Audit & Renewable</u> <u>Energy Development Assistance Grants (REAP EA/REDA)</u>, with an application deadline of February 1, 2021. REAP EA/REDA grants strengthen American energy independence by helping rural businesses gain access to more sources of renewable energy and establish energy-efficiency solutions.

Eligible applicants include public-body organizations, state and local governments, institutions of higher education, rural electric cooperatives, and public-power entities, among others. Applications are available for both energy-audit assistance and renewableenergy site assessments and technical assistance. The maximum annual aggregate amount of an energy audit and REDA grant is \$100,000. In 2020, the program provided \$291,474 in funding for Vermont and New Hampshire rural communities. Projects from 2020 include:

- Lakes Region Community College Technical assistance helps agricultural producers and rural small businesses throughout New Hampshire implement solar photovoltaic and wood thermal energy.
- New Hampshire Community Development Finance Authority Provides businesses with energy-savings strategies and technical assistance to identify project funding sources through partner organizations.
- Vermont Department of Forest, Parks and Recreation- Partners with the Biomass Energy Resource Center to help hospitality businesses like hotels and inns reduce fossil-fuel use and convert to efficient wood-heat systems.
