## USDA Rural Development Accepting Community Development Grant Applications for 2021, Technical Assistance & Training

Mid-February Webinars to Guide Submissions of RCDI and CFTAT Grant Applications, Due Late March

*MONTPELIER, VT*, January 28, 2021 – USDA Rural Development is now accepting applications for two community funding programs: <u>Rural Community Development Initiative grants</u> (RCDI) and <u>Community Facilities Technical Assistance and Training grants</u> (CFTAT).

Electronic applications via <a href="www.grants.gov">www.grants.gov</a> are due Monday, March 22 @ 12AM EST. Paper applications by mail are due Monday, March 29 @ 4PM EST.

Informational webinars on both programs are set for February (follow the links to register):

<u>CFTAT webinar</u> – Tuesday, February 16 @ 2-3PM EST <u>RCDI webinar</u> – Thursday, February 18 @ 2-3PM EST

CFTAT grants provide funding for technical assistance and/or training with respect to identifying and planning for essential community needs. RCDI grants are awarded to help low-income communities and community development organizations support economic development.

Public bodies and non-profits are eligible for grant funding though both programs, while RCDI also accepts applications from qualified private organizations. Recent projects include:

- **Northern Forest Center** Recipient of a \$188,547 RCDI grant in 2019 to expand broadband access and digital literacy within rural communities in VT, NH and ME.
- **New Hampshire Community Development Finance Authority** Used \$110,498 in 2020 CFTAT funding to provide energy-related assistance in rural NH communities.
