Distributed Generation Energy Project Financing

• Existing RUS Electric Program

What does this program do?

This program provides loans and loan guarantees to energy developers for distributed energy projects, including grid-connected renewable energy projects, that provide wholesale or retail electricity to existing USDA Rural Development, Rural Utility Service (RUS) Electric Program borrowers or other electric utilities serving rural communities.

Who can apply?

- Energy project developers for distributed energy projects with a power purchase agreement (PPA) that serves rural customers.
- Wholly-owned subsidiaries of an existing RUS borrower
- Utilities serving rural areas

What is an eligible area?

Projects must serve areas with less than 20,000 residents. If less than 75% of the power goes to rural areas, then the loan amount is limited to the percentage provided to rural areas.

How can funds be used?

Funds can be used to build:

- Energy generation projects, including renewable energy projects
- Distributions lines
- Energy storage systems

Is there a deadline to apply?

What are some of the loan terms?

- For others besides existing RUS borrowers, the maximum RUS loan amount is 75% of the total project costs
- The length of the loan cannot exceed 30 years.
