What does this program do?

This program provides funding to nonprofit organizations who in turn provide technical assistance and training to:

- Identify and evaluate solutions to water and waste problems
- Help applicants prepare applications for water and waste disposal loans and grants
- Help associations improve the operation and maintenance of water and waste facilities in eligible rural areas.

Who can apply?

Nonprofits with the ability, background, experience, and capacity to provide technical assistance or training on a national, regional, or state basis.

What is an eligible area?

 Rural areas and towns with 10,000 or fewer residents, including tribal lands and colonias in rural areas.

What are some of the terms of the grant?

- The project period for these grants is one year starting Oct. 1 and ending Sept. 30.
- Applicant contributions must be used before USDA grant funds.
- This is a reimbursement grant.
- Grants are subject to the availability of funds.
