Total length of the transmission lines for the proposed project will be approximately 125 miles. The project study area includes part or all of the following counties in Iowa: Clayton and Dubuque. In Wisconsin, the project area includes parts of the following counties: Dane, Grant, Iowa, and Lafayette.

Among the alternatives RUS will address in the EIS is the No Action alternative, under which the project would not be undertaken. In the EIS, the effects of the proposed project will be compared to the existing conditions in the area affected. Alternative transmission line corridors and the intermediate substation location will be refined as part of the EIS scoping process and will be addressed in the Draft EIS. RUS will carefully study public health and safety, environmental impacts, and engineering aspects of the proposed project and all related facilities.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) are participating in the environmental review process as cooperating agencies, with RUS as the lead Federal agency.

RUS will use input provided by government agencies, private organizations, and the public in the preparation of the Draft EIS. The Draft EIS will be available for review and comment for 45 days. A Final EIS that considers all comments received will subsequently be prepared. The Final EIS will be available for review and comment for 30 days. Following the 30-

Foreign-Trade Zone (FTZ) 38— Spartanburg County, South Carolina; Notification of Proposed Production Activity; ZF Transmissions Gray Court, LLC; (Automatic Transmission and Powertrain Subassemblies and Parts, Transmission Shafts and Cranks); Gray Court, South Carolina

ZF Transmissions Gray Court, LLC (ZF Transmissions) submitted a notification of proposed production activity to the FTZ Board for its facilities in Gray Court, South Carolina within FTZ 38. The notification conforming to the requirements of the regulations of the FTZ Board (15 GFR 400.22) was received on November 10, 2016.

ZF Transmissions already has authority to produce automatic transmissions for motor vehicles within Sites 20 and 25 of FTZ 38. The current request would add finished products and foreign status materials/components to the scope of authority. Pursuant to 15 CFR 400.14(b), additional FTZ authority would be limited to the specific foreign-status materials/components and specific finished products described in the submitted notification (as described below) and subsequently authorized by the FTZ Board.

Production under FTZ procedures could exempt ZF Transmissions from customs duty payments on the foreign-status materials/components used in export production. On its domestic sales, ZF Transmissions would be able to choose the duty rates during customs entry procedures that apply to automatic transmissions and powertrain subassemblies and parts, transmission shafts and cranks (duty rate ranges from free to 2.5%) for the foreign-status materials/components noted below and in the existing scope of authority. Customs duties also could possibly be deferred or reduced on foreign-status production equipment.

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Cardinal-Hickory Creek Transmission Line Project Public Scoping Meetings



The Rural Utilities Service (RUS), an agency within the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), intends to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Cardinal-Hickory Creek Transmission Line Project. The Cardinal-Hickory Creek Transmission Line Project is a proposed 345-kilovolt transmission line from the existing Cardinal Substation in Dane County, Wisconsin, to the Hickory Creek Substation in Dubuque County, lowa (see attached map). A new substation is also planned in the area of Montfort, Wisconsin. Depending on the route alternative selected, the project will be 90 to 135 miles long.

American Transmission Company (ATC), ITC Midwest LLC (ITC), and Dairyland Power Cooperative (Dairyland) (collectively referred to here as the "Utilities") are jointly developing the project. Dairyland intends to ask the RUS for financial assistance to fund its ownership interest in the transmission line portion of the project. Prior to making a decision about whether to make loan funds available, guarantee a loan, or award a grant for a proposed project, the RUS is required to conduct an environmental review under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The RUS NEPA process includes the development of an EIS that will consider and disclose a broad range of potential environmental issues. Two federal agencies, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, have been invited to participate as cooperating agencies in the federal review process.

The NEPA public scoping process serves multiple goals for the proposed project, including:

- · Soliciting public comments
- · Discovering alternatives to a proposed action (preferred route)
- · Identifying potential significant issues
- · Eliminating insignificant issues
- · Communicating information
- · Consulting with agencies and organizations



Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Why is this transmission line needed?

A. Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc., the regional electric transmission organization, proposed and approved the Cardinal-Hickory Creek Project as part of a portfolio of 17 transmission line projects that were identified as "Multi-Value Projects" for delivering multiple benefits to electric consumers across the Midwest region. Specifically, the Cardinal-Hickory Creek Project will improve electric system reliability, provide economic benefits to utilities and electric consumers, and expand the electric infrastructure to support public policy for greater use of renewable energy.

Q. What is the anticipated timeline for this project?

Q. Which resource issues have been identified so far?

A. The transmission line could potentially cross the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife Refuge. The project may also have visual impacts to historic trails administered by the National Park Service. High value habitat for federally listed species protected under the Endangered Species Act may be affected. The project may also have visual impacts to viewers from the Wisconsin Scenic Byway. Finally, there is strong stakeholder interest in areas where the transmission line would be in proximity to communities.

Q. What will this project look like? How tall will the poles be?

A. Typically, transmission line structures for this voltage are 100 to 150 feet tall, but the final design of the line will depend on many factors. In addition, the Utilities will consider opportunities to combine this line with other transmission lines in the area, collocating existing lines and the new Cardinal-Hickory Creek Project on new structures, which will also impact the final appearance of the line. Typical right-of-way width requested in Wisconsin will be approximately 150 feet. In lowa, the typical width of the right-of-way will be approximately 200 feet.

Q. What is the route for the new transmission line?

A. A route for the new transmission line has not been determined. Based on analysis and discussions with stakeholder groups, the Utilities have identified two preliminary major corridors with several potential subroute variations (see attached map). These corridors were developed based on analyses of a number of factors, including the location identified for a Mississippi River crossing. In Wisconsin, routing criteria under state law requires giving priority to using existing corridors, such as existing transmission lines, highways, roads, railroads, etc. In lowa, state law requires new transmission lines to be routed along roads, active railroads, and along division lines of land where practical and reasonable. These corridors will be reviewed through the state regulatory routing process and the federal NEPA process.

Q. Are these corridors final, or are they subject to change? What would cause them to change?

A. These are the corridors currently under study based on the analyses that have been completed so far and input received through public outreach in Wisconsin and Iowa. The final proposed routes (Iowa considers a single proposed route, Wisconsin requires two proposed routes) will come through further analyses and review through the state regulatory routing processes and the federal NEPA process.

Q. Where will this project cross the Mississippi River?

A. The Utilities and the RUS are working with multiple agencies and jurisdictions, including the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, to determine the optimum location and obtain the necessary approvals and permits for the Mississippi River crossing. Based on those conversations and extensive analyses, the Utilities have identified locations near Cassville, Wisconsin, as the most suitable locations for crossing the river. The Utilities have found these locations, which include existing transmission corridors, to offer the least potential social, environmental, and engineering impacts.

Q. What is the approval process for Wisconsin?

A. Once ATC, ITC, and Dairyland submit an application in Wisconsin, the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) will review the project application to determine if there is enough information to begin the regulatory review process and then, once the application is determined to be complete, notify the public about the project and hold scoping meetings to provide the public an opportunity to talk with PSCW staff and learn about the PSCW's review process; create an EIS (i.e., a detailed analysis with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources of how the project might affect the human and natural environments); and hold technical and public hearings for the project. Once the application is determined to be complete by the PSCW, the agency will make its determination on whether to grant a Certificate of Public Convenience and Need for the project within a year, as required by state statute.

Q. What is the approval process in lowa?

A. After a public informational meeting is held in each county where the project is proposed, ITC and Dairyland will file a petition(s) for a franchise with the lowa Utilities Board (IUB) for any portion of the transmission line located outside municipal boundaries. A franchise petition must be submitted for each county traversed by the proposed transmission line. Following receipt of the petition, the IUB will review it for any errors or omissions. After the petition is deemed complete, there are two paths for the franchise proceeding. If no objections are filed and the petition does not request the power of eminent domain, then a notice will be published in a newspaper in each county and the IUB may grant a franchise without holding a hearing. If objections to the petition are filed or if the applicants request eminent domain authority, a hearing will be held before the IUB. Following the hearing, the IUB may grant or deny the franchise in whole or in part.

Public Hearing

Once a franchise petition is filed, lowa law requires that the public hearing be held on the proposed electric transmission line if objections to the franchise petition are on file or if the party filing the franchise petition requests the right of eminent domain. If the line length exceeds one mile, the hearing must be held in the county seat of the county located at the midpoint of the proposed transmission line.

Any person whose interests may be affected by the project may file an objection with the IUB using its Electronic Filing System (EFS), efs.iowa.gov. Persons without Internet access may mail objections addressed to the Iowa Utilities Board, 1375 E. Court Avenue, Room 69, Des Moines, Iowa 50319. A form that may be used for filing an objection is available on the IUB web site at iub.iowa.gov. Persons filing objections should include their full name and mailing address, e-mail address if available, and indicate the IUB docket number in their correspondence. E-mail objections other than filings in EFS cannot be accepted.

The franchise hearing is a formal, evidentiary process governed by Iowa law and IUB rules. It is similar to a trial held by a judge in district court, although there is no jury. A franchise hearing may be conducted by a Board-appointed administrative law judge or by the Board. All testimony must be taken under oath, so witnesses are sworn in prior to testifying. The Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) is a party that represents the public interest in all IUB hearings. The OCA does not represent any individual customer or member of the public.



Decision Process

After a public hearing, all evidence presented in a case is reviewed. If the case is assigned to an administrative law judge (ALJ), the ALJ hearing the case will issue a proposed decision order. If parties wish to appeal a proposed decision to the Board, they must file a notice of appeal with the IUB within a specified time after the proposed decision is issued, typically 15 days.

The Board has the authority to review a proposed decision even if no one appeals it. If there is no appeal and the Board does not review it, a proposed decision typically becomes the final decision of the Board 16 days after it was issued. If there is an appeal or the Board decides to review a proposed decision, the Board will issue a procedural order that tells the parties how the appeal will be handled. The Board itself would issue a final decision and order in such a case.

When the Board has decided the case, any party to the proceeding may file for rehearing within 20 days. Upon issuance of a final decision on rehearing, any party may appeal to lowa District Court within 30 days.

Transmission Line Franchises

lowa law provides the Iowa Utilities Board (IUB) the authority to grant or deny the franchise requests of parties seeking to construct, maintain, and operate electric transmission lines outside of cities in Iowa. The IUB must consider granting a franchise in each county where a party proposes transmission lines. The IUB does not have siting authority regarding transmission lines that run inside of city limits. A transmission line is defined as an electric line capable of operating at 69,000 volts or more.

lowa law states that the IUB may grant franchises in whole or in part upon such terms, conditions, and restrictions as are just and proper, and with such modifications as to line location and route as are just and proper.

To obtain a franchise, the applicant must show that the proposed transmission line is necessary to serve a public use. The applicant must also show that the proposed line is reasonably related to an overall plan of transmitting electricity in the public interest and will conform to established construction and safety requirements. Iowa Code chapter 478 and IUB rules at 199 Iowa Administrative Code chapters 11 and 25 govern electric transmission line cases in Iowa, Links to the lowa Code and the IUB rules are available on the IUB Web site, iub.iowa.gov.

Informational Meetings

The party proposing to petition for a franchise is required to hold a public informational meeting not less than 30 days before a franchise petition can be filed with the IUB. A meeting must be held in each lowa county through which a proposed line would be constructed. Notice of a public informational meeting must be provided at least 30 days in advance to each landowner with property that may be affected by the project. Affected landowner determinations are based on county real estate assessment records.

Representatives of the party proposing to petition for a franchise and the IUB, will be present at the informational meeting. The purpose of the meeting is to explain to landowners the franchise process, rights of the landowners, the scope of the proposed project, and to provide an opportunity for landowners to ask questions. No formal record is made of informational meetings and no formal public comments are received at these meetings.


The party that proposes a project may not begin contacting landowners to secure easements until an informational meeting has been held in the county. An informational meeting is not required for short transmission lines that would affect less than one mile of private property rights. When a petition for franchise is filed with the IUB, and deemed to be substantially complete, a notice of filing will be published two times in a newspaper of general circulation in each affected county. The deadline for filing objections is 20 days after the second notice-of-filing publication.
